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Summer Foods Service Program January Claim

- During January SISD's Child Nutrition Program served 1,333 breakfasts and 1,707 lunches
- Pending reimbursement is \$17,254.87.

Average Daily Participation by site:

- Kasaan 48%
- Coffman Cove 59%
- Naukati 62%
- Thorne Bay 62%
- Whale Pass 90%
- Port Alexander 89%
- Hollis 89%

Summer 2021 Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Intent to Operate

- The SFSP was established to ensure that low-income children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session. Free meals that meet Federal nutrition guidelines are provided to all children at approved SFSP sites in areas with significant concentrations of low-income children.
- According to Alaska Department of Education & Early Development 2020 Free and Reduced report the following schools have a free and reduced rate of at least 50% and are eligible for 2012 summer meal service.
 - Kasaan, Naukati, Port Alexander, Thorne Bay, and Whales Pass
 - As open sites any child 18 years of age and younger can be served. Children participating in the meal service are not required to be enrolled in a program.
- Reimbursement Rates: Breakfast - \$3.99; Lunch - \$6.99

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) Continuation Request Submitted

- The FFVP is competitive funding opportunity and schools will be selected & prioritized by utilizing student eligibility for free or reduced-price meals (SY19 data will be used due to pandemic) and the amount of funding the state receives.
- All SISD schools qualify for this funding.

USDA Food Distribution Entitlement (Commodities)

- U.S. foods purchased by the USDA, which are provided to schools at minimal cost (delivery fees).
- SISD's entitlement for the 2021/22 school year is \$8,542.58
