# Kindergarten Information Meeting

### > School/Family/Community: The Joyce Epstein Model for School Improvement

The Emerson School Leadership team attended the course at West 40 on May 22<sup>nd</sup> on the Joyce Epstein Model for School Improvement. The team activity and work plan included writing a draft of the school's one year action plan for partnerships for the 2012-2013 school year. # Preschool for All, Celebration of Learning

The Preschool for All, Celebration of Learning was held on May 30<sup>th</sup> at the Melrose Park Civic Center for 155 PFA families. Students received certificates, performed songs and enjoyed a picnic style lunch with their families and teachers. 106 students will be transitioning to Kindergarten from Preschool.
