Legislative Update – 85th Regular Session

Board Goals:

Objectives:

- Review Moak, Casey & Associates summary on the House Public Education Committee's meeting on Tuesday, April 18, 2017 (see attached)
- Discussion: The Texas House gave final approval to House Bill 21 on Thursday, April 20, 2017
 - HB 21 injects \$1.6 billion into public schools, simplifies the complex formulas for allocating the money, and targets certain disadvantaged student groups for more funding (<u>https://www.texastribune.org/2017/04/19/texas-house-school-finance-bill/</u>)
 - CSHB 21 does the following
 - Commits \$1.8 billion above enrollment growth
 - Moves toward a more simplified system

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- Adds greater equity by increasing the basic allotment
- Reduces recapture
- Includes a new weight for students with dyslexia at 0.1
- Increases the bilingual weight from 0.1 to 0.11
- Provides transitional grant funding for those districts impacted by the expiration of ASATR

 - "The proposed formula would provide the same base per-student funding to every district, with additional money for students in four specific groups: English language learners, students with disabilities, economically disadvantaged students and students receiving training for technical jobs."
