# Family & Consumer Science and FCCLA – Ashley McIlravy

#### **Courses:**

**Human Growth and Development** – Students are currently learning about the physical, emotional, and intellectual growth of newborns through preschoolers.

**Dollars and Sense** – Students in this course are learning about the cost of credit, credit scores, credit reports, and specific types of credit.

**Fashion Design** – In this course, students attended a field trip to TWU in Denton to visit college Fashion Design courses. They are also learning about beginning sewing techniques and simple alterations.

**Lifetime Nutrition and Wellness** – Students in this course learned how to calculate their BMR, the different types of exercise, and how to manage weight.

**Interior Design** – Students in this course are learning about floor and appliance care and selection in homes.

#### **English – Dooley**

#### <u>English I</u>

Over the next few weeks, we will be preparing for the End of Course Exam. We will be concentrating on reading strategies for analyzing the stories during the End of Course Exam. We will be writing at least 2 more expository essays and practicing prewriting to make sure all of our thoughts are organized. We will be practicing short answer questions in order to feel comfortable with the APER formula. The week after spring break we will go over everything one more time in order to refresh everyone memory. Students will get the chance to ask any questions and voice

any concerns that they might have before the test. I will attempt to make everyone feel as comfortable as possible about the impending EOC Exam.

#### English II

Deaver's English II students are completing <u>The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde</u>, by Robert Louis Stevenson. In this unit, students have probed human nature and written an essay relating Dr. Jekyll' struggle with his "dark side" to their own struggles with choices. Also, they have written a persuasive essay in which they had to assume the role of the prosecution or the defense in a trial where Mr. Hyde has been charged with the murder of Sir Danvers Carew and present a closing argument to the jury and judge. Throughout the unit, we have continued to work on skills of inferencing, critical thinking, the entire writing process, focusing on addressing a prompt accurately with coherent, well-supported writing. After spring break, we will round out the year with Shakespeare's <u>A Midsummer Night's Dream</u> and George Orwell's <u>Animal Farm</u>.

## Pre AP English II

The students are reading <u>The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde</u> by Robert Louis Stevenson. As they read, they are logging entries in dialectical journals, catching details about the context of the novel, theme, setting, characterization, and even poetic and rhetorical devices. Next, we will "pull the threads" of these notations that they have made in a project to help them see the patterns and development of strategic writing. They are doing a good job and impressing me with their insight. We are still working on refining our skills using context clues by taking weekly vocabulary quizzes and taking vocab. tests periodically.

## English III

## English IV

It is research paper time! The students have been in the computer lab researching over the last two weeks. They have completed 50 notecards from 5 sources, created outlines, practiced summarizing, paraphrasing, and quoting to avoid plagiarism, and discussed, viewed, and practiced effective introductions to get ready to type their rough drafts. Next week we will conference, one on one, to make final adjustments to the essays. They are really getting the idea that there are a lot of elements to writing an effective research paper. We are still working on refining our skills using context clues by taking weekly vocabulary quizzes and taking vocab. tests periodically.
