Provide Professional Development for teachers to improve reading interventions.

Purchase Acadience (DIBELS) Next for 4th and 5th grades. Assess all students at the beginning, middle, and end of year. Students at risk of falling below reading level will receive RtI in small groups, individually, and/or with a Reading Tutor. These students will be progress monitored using the Acadience Next software.

Hire a part-time Reading Tutor. Train the tutor in the Star Reading program. Tutor will work with teachers to identify students in need, train volunteers, and implement reading program.
