#### (Brandy Bremner: Instructional Coaches)

Dear Members of the Board,

As an Instructional Coach I am often charged with reporting student assessment data, showing how many students are in each Tier, providing numbers on Tier movement, and sharing where we are in certain academic processes. At the KW/Vina November board meeting I was given the opportunity, and time, to provide a deeper look behind the data. That look included;

- Explaining the importance of both Language Comprehension and Word Recognition in the developing reader
- Demonstrating how the English language is a complex code
- Showing what our assessments look like and explaining what students need to know and be able to do on those assessments
- Explaining what we do with the assessment data at an MTSS meeting
- Explaining how we progress monitor our students on a 10 PDSA day cycle I appreciate the opportunity I had to share our processes, explain foundational skills, and teach you a little bit more about what it takes to become a reader. #### (Andrea Evans: Instructional Coaches)

At the beginning of November, first-grade teachers were introduced to our new writing rubric that follows Ehri's Phases of Literacy (Pre-Alphabetic, Early Alphabetic, Later Alphabetic, and Consolidated Alphabetic). Kindergarten - third grade will use this new rubric to assess students' writing skills and growth. Teachers chose four books that they will dialogically read each quarter and created writing prompts to go with each of the books they chose. After completing the writing assessment, teachers will score and sort their students using Ehri's Phases of Literacy and Writing. Teachers will work collaboratively to ensure accuracy while sorting their students' writings into each phase. Once that is complete, teachers will drive their writing instruction to meet the needs of each student - meeting them where they are at in the writing process. Teachers will use instructional goals and activities to help students through the many different phases of writing. I am proud of our first-grade team and their fantastic work ethic to increase student achievement in literacy and writing.

#### (Marci Burd: First Grade Team Leader)

This month 1st grade spent the month preparing for our annual powwow. This was a huge success and the students were so proud and excited. Along with that we were reading Napi stories preparing for the end of the month Napi visit. This was one of the highlights of their month. The kids were beyond excited that Napi came to life. They had the opportunity to share their favorite Napi story. This month we also really worked hard on our writing skills so the students can start their first

writing assessment this year. It was great to see such amazing results. As a first grade team we also implemented "Blackfeet words of the week" to go over during calendar time and at the end of the day. Happy November! Our objective is to provide Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Services to each and every student (Early-K, K, 1st G.). The SEL team is teaching the Conscious Discipline curriculum focusing on how to identify and regulate their emotions along with teaching Problem solving skills.

#### November Updates/Duties

The SEL team teaches their own Specials class Monday-Friday using the Conscious Discipline Curriculum. In November the students who were flagged in the DESSA Assessments were added to individual/group counseling services

provided by the SEL team members. Each team member has their own schedule and caseload of students whom they will be meeting with at least twice a week. The Conscious Discipline Curriculum will be used to focus on the areas of social emotional competencies during the small and individual counseling sessions.

The SEL team distributes food bags every last day of the week before the weekend to students in each classroom. The team also identifies students who may need clothing from the clothing closet whether it is socks, pants, shirt, coats, gloves, shoes, boots, ect. Each team member helps with tasks throughout the building such as: bus & pick-up, meet & greet, Lunch and recess duties, ect.

Juliana Salois is the SEL team leader and has been training the Conscious Discipline to the new staff Nikki, Jennifer and Nathan.
