

BACKGROUND

What is the MSS?

The Minnesota Student Survey (MSS) is a voluntary and anonymous school-based survey that began in 1989 and is conducted to gain insights into the world of students and their experiences.

When is the MSS offered?

The MSS is offered every three years, with the next survey being offered between January and June 2025.

BACKGROUND

What questions does the MSS ask?

The MSS includes three age-appropriate questionnaires that cover a wide range of topics, including demographics, substance use, health concerns, mental health, school climate, and risk and protective factors.



The SE MN region is considered the green counties in the map to the right. This data can be used by counties for planning and decision making around programs and community partnerships.


To protect student confidentiality, data in this dashboard is suppressed if numbers are less than 5.


About MSS:

- The survey is conducted every 3 years. This dashboard contains data from the 2016, 2019, and 2022 surveys.
- Students in grades 5, 8, 9, and 11 are surveyed, although not all grades are asked the same questions.
- Not all school districts participate in the survey.
- · When a school participates, all students in the grades listed above are offered the survey. Students may opt out of the survey.











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
Percent of County Students Reported Using Marijuana in Past 12 Months by Year & Selected Demographic




Of Students Who Missed Any School In Last 30 Days, Percentage of Minnesota Students Reasons For Missing Any School by Year




Five Fruits & Vegetables

Schedule survey administration between January - June 2025.

Notify parents at least two weeks prior to survey administration.

Administer the survey – most students complete it in 30 minutes.

MSS 2025 ADMINISTRATION

Schools who complete the survey by early March receive an executive summary of findings in May.

As MSS reports are published and data is visualized, SCPH staff will provide support to school districts in accessing and utilizing the data.


