Tracy Bell, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, reports on the following:

Strategic Goal 2: Instructional Supports

Objective 1: Evaluation of Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)

- Updates to the MTSS Strategic Plan ensures a more structured and actionable framework that supports student success. This process includes refining data tracking, intervention monitoring, and resource alignment to improve decision-making at all levels. The goal is to create a cohesive and responsive system.
- Current Focuses:
 - Build and test MTSS monitoring dashboard (June 2025).
 - Supporting Alaska Reads Act at sites.
 - Refining Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (Safe & Civil Schools) systems.
 - Developing instructional support and professional development schedules to support AK Reads Act and regular data review.

Objective 2: Safe & Civil Schools Refresh

• **Current Focuses**: Susan Isaac's visits are largely completed. She will be traveling to Kiana and Noatak the last week of February. Her time in Kotzebue will be spent on 25-26 school year planning with Directors.

Curriculum Program & Project Updates:

- **Nuna Ilisimman Development:** The Physical Earth Science Pilot remains in progress in Shungnak, Kiana, Noatak, and Deering, with continued curriculum refinement and implementation.
- **Early Learning:** NWABSD continues its participation in the Learn & Grow Program to support grant requirements and program development.
- Professional Development: 10 teachers and 2 Curriculum Department staff will attend the Anchorage Association of Early Childhood Conference from February 18-23 to enhance early learning initiatives.
- **Iñupiaq Language Program:** Ongoing work focuses on **scope and sequence development** and the creation of **benchmark assessments** to support language instruction across grade levels.
 - Collaboration with Aqqaluk Trust, Nikaichaut, UAF-Chukchi continues to support language revitalization initiatives.
- Career & Technical Education (CTE) Program: Ongoing planning focuses on program alignment, course offerings, and workforce readiness pathways.
