Facts of this Matter:

- 1. Travel destination and dates: University of Cincinnati from January 24-25, 2026. We plan to leave Saturday, January 24th at 6:30 am and return by 6:30 pm on Sunday January 25th.
- 2. Who is attending: 30 student members of the Model UN club and two chaperones will attend. The grades involved are 9th to 12th grade.
- 3. Synopsis of the trip: The event has students participate in a high-level debate with students from around the area on current world issues. This competition highlights several important skills such as public speaking, research, and conflict resolution.

Objective POSITIVES related to this item or approach:

As a teaching method, the model UN has been proven-effective. Students role-play various countries in the world. They learn about the history, politics, and foreign policies of several countries and begin to understand the importance of the United Nations in the world today. Students become familiar with several international problems or issues and experience the give and take of diplomacy as they attempt to pass resolutions in their councils. The model provides an opportunity for them to improve their public speaking and debate skills and to learn some parliamentary procedure. They will begin to learn the skills of how to work constructively in a group when members of the group disagree on how to achieve a particular goal. The experience is a win-win situation for students
