SUMMARY

I promised parents that I would bring this back to the board once the levy election had been held. At the time of posting for this board agenda, the outcome of the levy election is unknown. Regardless of the outcome of the levy, we have to find additional ways to cut costs moving forward. We have made so many cuts to non-personnel costs (supplies, resources, materials, etc) that there are very few ways to continue to cut costs without cutting staff. Moving to a 4 day school week can help us reduce utility costs without eliminating staff. Childcare Option for Fridays

I have heard from high school math teachers that they are concerned about the impact on overall math instruction in a 4 day school week schedule. I reached out to Post Falls and Bonners Ferry for input. Post Falls is finishing their second year on a 4 day schedule. The superintendent has not heard any concerns from the staff at PFHS and they have not seen a decrease in math scores; however it is early in the process for them. Bonners Ferry has been on a 4 day schedule since 2009. When I spoke to the



superintendent for Bonners Ferry she indicated that they have not seen a dip in achievement. They have been pretty consistent.

Superintendent Recommendation

I recommend that we move to a 4 day school week for the 2025-26 school year. This will allow us to realize some cost savings in utilities and guest teachers, and potentially increase state revenue through a small increase in average daily attendance. If we are going to continue to shrink our dependence on a levy, we have to find alternative ways to increase our general fund.

Based on the 2023-24 expenditures for utilities (Avista, KEC, Cities of Athol, Rathdrum, Spirit Lake, N. Kootenai Water, Gem State Water, TLI Sewer), this is a rough estimate of the savings if 9 of our schools are closed on Fridays. I only calculated utility costs for August - May.

Total spent on utilities: \$870,969.56

Number of days: 181

Average daily utility cost: \$4811.99

31 Fridays of non-usage: \$149,171.58

LHS/THS costs: \$27,122.11

Net utility savings: 122,049.48

I was unable to pull THS and LHS out of the overall costs. If we assume everything is equal (knowing it's not) the daily utility cost per school is \$437.45.

Approximately \$27,122.11 of the savings would not be recognized as THS and LHS will be open on most Fridays due to extra curricular and co-curricular activities.

During the 2024-24 school year we spent \$131,000 on guest teachers on Fridays.

While there may be small savings on salaries/benefits, we are doing everything we can to keep people whole.

Our conservative estimation of cost savings is: \$253,049.48


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

Q2 Even when our levy passes in May, the district will have to look into different cost saving measures to stay afloat. We will have no funding for the maintenance of our buildings and we will continue to pay more in salaries and benefits than we receive from the state. One of the brainstorms we have as a cost saving measure would be to switch to a 4day school week. The cost savings comes from a reduction in utility costs as we would close all of our schools on Fridays with the exception of LHS and THS. Districts in our region who are on a 4-day school week are seeing an increase in ADA, which could equate to additional revenue from the state. Our recommendation would be to have a calendar very similar to Post Falls with the exception of Thanksgiving Break. Post Falls teachers only have Wed - Fri off. We will continue to take the whole week. Post Falls' calendar for the 2025-26 school year is linked here for you to have a sense of what the year would look like. If there were NO FURLOUGH DAYS and NO REDUCTION IN SALARIES and BENEFITS, are you in favor of the district moving to a 4-Day School Week?

When we surveyed the parents about the 4 day school week, several parents who voted no reached out to me to let me know that child care was their main concern. We propose that we run BASE on Fridays at THS and LHS. This keeps all of the other nine schools closed to help us realize the greatest savings potential. We would build the cost of breakfast and lunch into the tuition. Parents would have to enroll, this can't be a drop in service because of the licensing parameters. We will have activities for the kids to do each Friday. There would be time for staff to assist students with assignments as well. We will have some classified staff whose hours will be reduced due to the change in schedule, but they will be able to be assigned shifts for Friday BASE in an effort to keep everyone whole.
