- I. Meeting Called to Order: Board President, Jorge Barrera called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance: Superintendent Mijares led the pledge of allegiance.
- Citizen's Communication Eagle Pass FFA Students-addressed the Board of Trustees and 111. Superintendent and gave a presentation on Drones in Agriculture. Drones that are designed specifically for Agriculture purposes play a key role in Position Agriculture also known as Site Specific Farming, a technique involving cropisurveillance and the use of cameras, sensors, and GPS. They help farmers with photos and mapping that cantip farmers to irrigation, soil and infestation problems they can also use 3D mapping to locate the problem areas. There are several kinds of attachments that can be attached to drones. Some are cameras, sprayers and 3D mapping. These help framers and ranchers improve the view of their fields to maintain and enhance production. A few of the down sides of drones is their initial cost (expensive), battery life is very short average is 20 minutes, not accurate due to glitches, cannot exterminate pests (hogs) on site, and attachments are expensive. Some drones ae designed to plant bio degradable seed pods and are capable of planting up to 3000 per day without heavy machinery. By doing this they save on fuel, tractors, planes and heavy machinery costs. New regulations from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) require that drone users take a course to earn a certificate to be able to fly them. This law helps in preventing accidents and keeping the airway safe for everyone. But this process is a complicated one and keeps farmers and ranchers from using drones that would otherwise help them. Getting this certificate means they have to pay to take the course or pay someone to fly the drone for them. They also have to adhere to new FAA rules as stated on the Texas Farm Bureau website for example: No flights are allowed at night, under covered structures or over people (unless you have a waiver), preflight inspection is required before every flight to endure a UAV is airworthy. The FAA has two different kinds of license to fly a drone. There is the commercial license which you pay somebody that has a license to acquire information of your property. Then there is the personal use license which you take a course and pay to get certified. Licenses start at \$150.00 and is good for two years. The FAA does not require the average person to have a

certification to fly a drone that falls under the toy use age category. Currently FAA rules state you cannot fly drones within five miles of airports or other aircrafts. Never fly them over groups of people, public events or stadium full of people.
