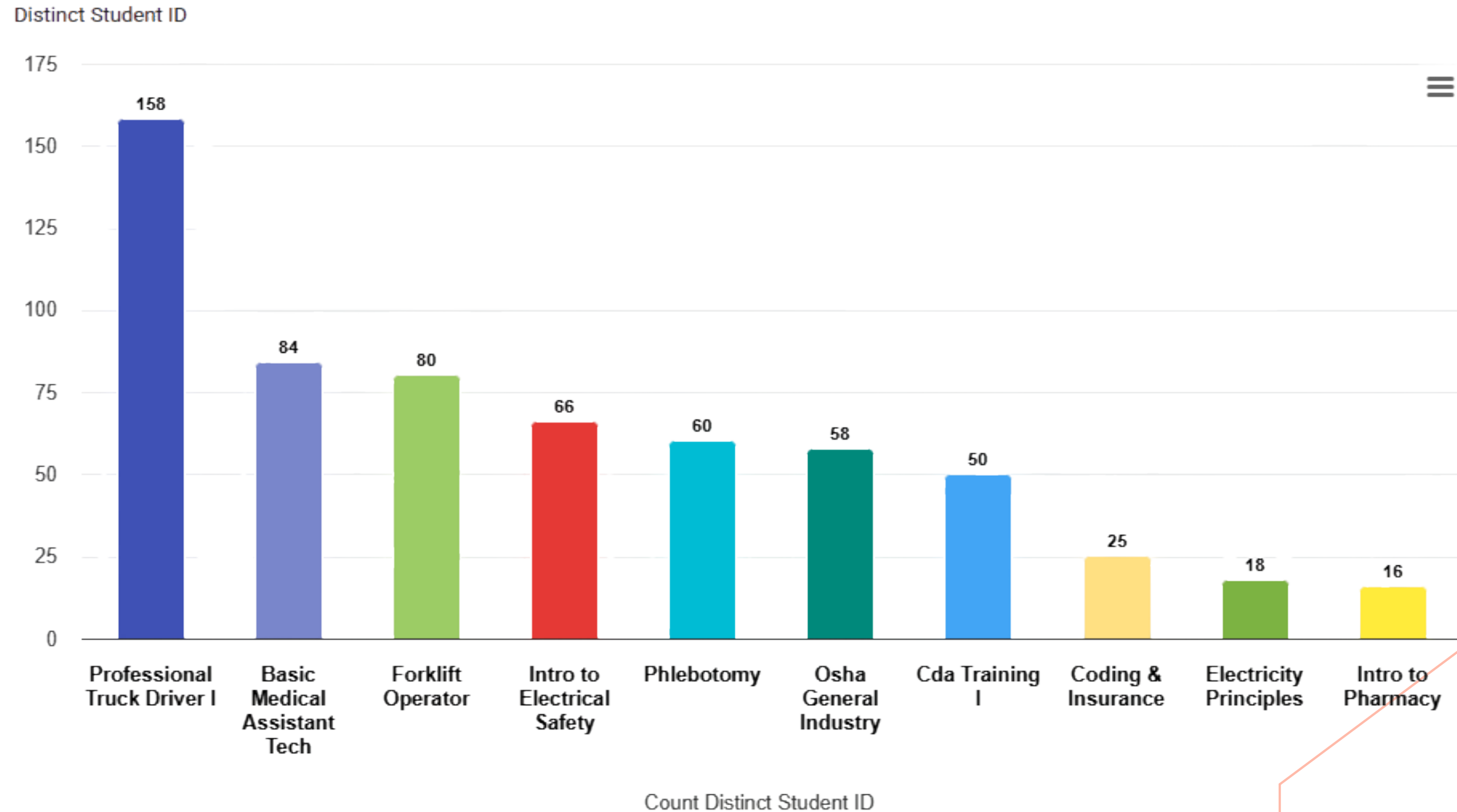

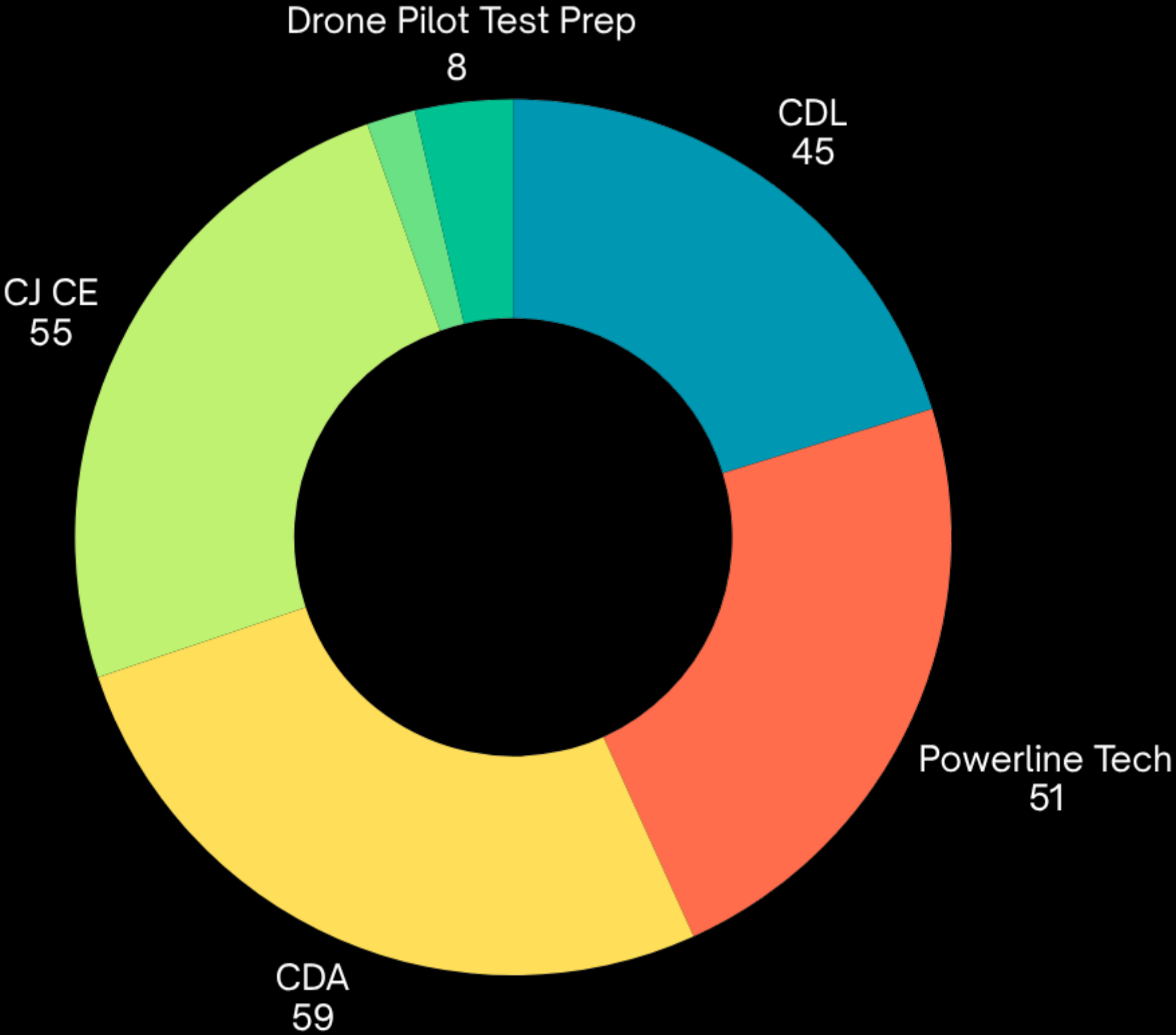

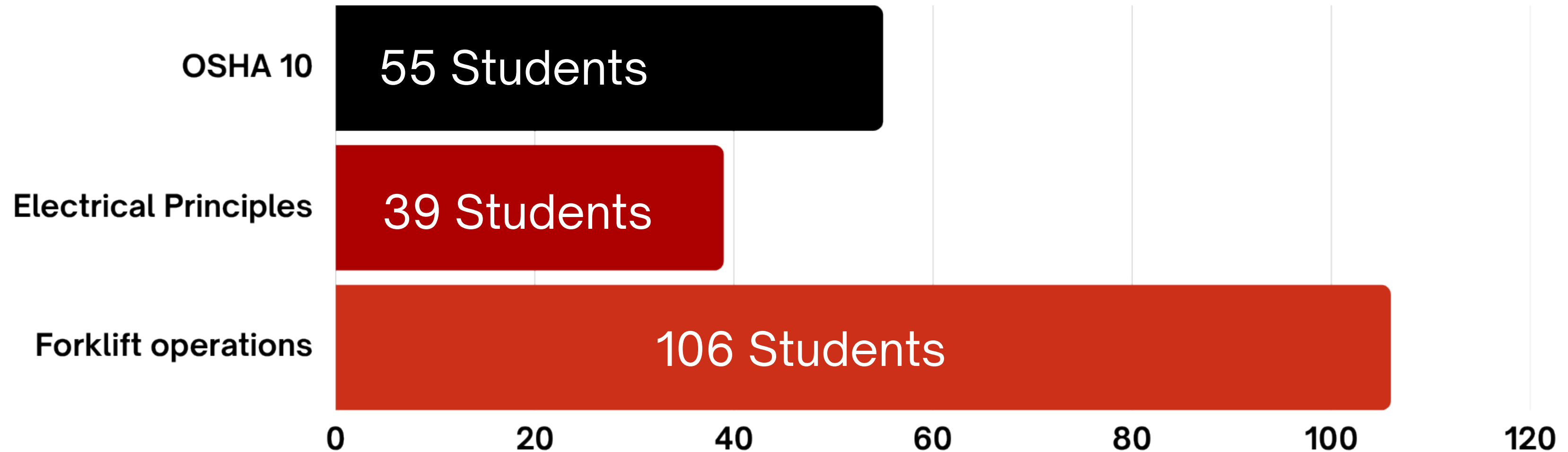


TRUE GRANT

Achievements include:



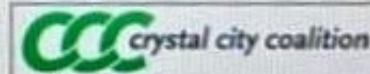
KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS



- Partnered with Hill Country MHDD to support Uvalde's new inpatient facility.
- Hill Country MHDD provided scholarships and training for our local workforce.
- Twenty-nine students completed training; 27 earned certifications.



The Crystal City Coalition, in partnership with Southwest Texas College (SWTXC), has launched a medical coding and electronic health records (EHR) class with 14 local students enrolled. This initiative is part of the Coalition's ongoing effort to equip residents with job-ready skills in high-demand fields.



- Southwest Texas College partnered with the Crystal City Coalition to launch a Medical Coding and Electronic Health Records class.
- Fourteen local students are enrolled in the program.
- The initiative provides job-ready skills for a growing career field.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION STUDENTS

Our Construction Principles course aligns with the college's Construction Science credit program, allowing students to earn advanced placement credit for industry-recognized coursework. This enables students to get credit for skills like carpentry, floor, wall, and roof systems, helping them accelerate their education and enter the workforce sooner.



REVENUE & REACH

Leveraging partnerships to expand training, strengthen communities, and deliver measurable results.

- Union Pacific Grant
- We trained 46 students in Introduction to Solar Panel Installation.
- We delivered training in Cotulla and Dilley High Schools.
- We surpassed our revenue goal by over \$155,000, reaching **\$1.67 million**.
- This was achieved through consistent program growth and strategic partnerships.
- This highlights the trust from partners in delivering quality workforce training.

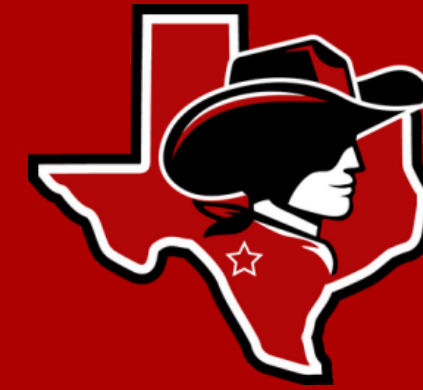
