We're Learning ...

- *... how to identify the <u>main idea</u> of a text, and of sections within a text (We need more practice and review with this). We will also begin working on asking and answering questions about a text.
 - *... counting & skip counting patterns (by 1s, 5s, 10s & 100s).
- *... about <u>single paragraph outlines</u>, in preparation for writing well-constructed paragraphs. This relates closely to our learning about main ideas and key details in reading.
- *... our songs for the school Christmas program, which will be Thursday, December 12, at 6:00 PM.
- **Also this week our spelling focus is words with long "a" and silent "e".. The ones that we *know* will be on our test are *make* and *came*. Our high frequency words are *what* and *was* (both review words).
