I. Enrollment:

- DMS currently has 303 students enrolled.
- II. School Improvement and Happenings:

❖ School Index:

- ➤ Each year, schools are given Index Scores based on seven categories. Five of these categories apply to Durand Middle School. Two categories do not, which are English Language Learners and Graduation Rate. We do not have a sufficient amount of ELLs to be given a score and graduation rate only applies to high schools. The areas DMS is scored on are Overall Score, Growth, Proficiency, School Quality, and Participation.
- DMS has seen significant improvements in these areas over the last two years. We have been working very hard to improve attendance, academic interventions, and behaviors. All of these factors result in higher levels of learning for students which is reflected in our Index Scores which come from our state testing data. All the scores are based on a scale from zero to one hundred.
- ➤ The Index scores were recently released and based on the M-Step and P-SAT tests that the students took in the Spring of 2024.


> We are very proud of the hard work we are doing and of our students and families for working with us to help every child succeed. Our goal is to continue to grow in these areas and prepare our students for success!

➤ We are continuing with our Positive Behavior rewards on a daily (On-Track Ticket drawings), weekly (no-referral reward), and monthly basis. We also have not missed a week yet for our cafeteria Fun Fridays. One way we are targeting attendance is by working to make school more fun which is one of our school goals for this year.

After School Clubs:

➤ We have several staff members that run clubs on a volunteer basis at DMS. We are blessed with teachers who go above and beyond for our students. Some of the clubs are E-sports, Science Club, Book Club, and Knitflix. Mrs. Frawley also runs Fast Track News in which students make our daily announcements video. Professional Development for Staff:

- During our staff meeting on January 8th, Elizabeth Findley from the SRESD came and worked with our teachers on de-escalation techniques for students who become unregulated and need help to recenter. This was a follow up to a more extensive training and a chance to revisit the techniques and ask questions.
- ➤ Teachers will be trained on the 20th of January in two areas. They will spend the morning continuing with our year-long training on Disciplinary Literacy. The afternoon will be focused on Social Emotional Learning. These are both areas that have proven to improve student achievement and will be time well spent.

School Safety Update:

- ➤ With the assistance of Nurse Kay, DMS completed our first AED drill which utilized our procedures for the BERT Team (Building Emergency Response Team). Each member of the team has a role to make sure that all necessary measures are taken in the event we have a cardiac emergency at the school. We then met to assess our response. This is not a mandated drill, but an area we want to practice to make sure we are ready for any emergency that may happen.
- Exterior and interior door signs are being installed at DMS and will assist emergency personnel in quickly locating where an emergency is taking place. The signs will also assist students and guests in finding rooms and entrances. Not only will they be very helpful in these situations, but they look sharp!
- ➤ All teachers and office personnel were assigned walkie talkies to be used in an emergency situation. At times, linelines, intercoms, and cell phones do not work. In these situations, all staff members can communicate through the use of the walkie talkies. These are a quick way to contact the office and all other staff members. Teachers were given guidelines for use and assigned walkie talkies at our January staff meeting.

Monthly Reward Competitions:

This month, sixth graders won in every category which includes highest rate of attendance, most On-Track Tickets, and least amount of missing assignments. Sixth graders will be given a reward in their Power Hour classes to celebrate! Great job sixth grade students!

II. Staff and Students of the Month (January):


