- 141 does not show any growth. Although the data has not decreased it has stayed at a steady pace. She indicated

142 grade nine is a concern, English, Language and Math are a big concern. She will be working more closely

143 with the 9th grade teachers. An intervention plan has been put into place for grade nine, she recommends

- 144 teachers to use 3-week grade report to monitor and progress their intervention plan. Another concern is the
- 145 9th grade Reading data. She indicated she is reviewing the curriculum and some changes need to be made so
- 146 that more reading is included in the 9th grade.
