**Crisis Management**

The Board of Education recognizes that students have a basic need for security and safety

in the school setting. Any event or circumstance which threatens the safety and security of

students and staff will be considered a crisis. There are unlimited possibilities for crisis

situations that could impact the district. Those include, but may not be limited to the

following situations: medical emergencies, suicide, death, acts of violence, trauma, natural

disaster, facility emergencies, and accidents.

The Board of Education acknowledges the necessity to implement a Crisis Management

Plan in the event that a crisis should occur. Therefore, the Superintendent shall develop

regulations to support this policy in the form of a Crisis Management Plan. The Crisis

Management Plan shall provide for:

an immediate and effective response to the actual emergency if such emergency

has occurred on or near school property, at a school-sponsored event or on a

field trip; and

an immediate and effective response to the psychological trauma resulting from

such an emergency.

The administration shall provide all staff members with ongoing in-service training

concerning implementation of the regulations.
