Operations Reports: December 2025

Ranger Woods Tree Removal: A total of 13 trees were removed from Ranger Woods—10 were dead and 3 were identified as unsafe. Trails have been fully cleaned, and all logs and debris have been cleared from student pathways to ensure safe access.

Leaf Debris Cleanup: All leaf debris cleanup across the district has been completed. Our next area of focus will be the cleanup on the ball fields

Irrigation Winterization: All district irrigation systems have been winterized and successfully blown out for the season.

Custodial Substitutes: This month, we will be concentrating on hiring custodial substitutes to support building operations.

High School Seismic Upgrade: Next week, we will be interviewing contractors for the seismic upgrade project in the high school commons area.

School Signage: The Rivermill sign is now fully operational. We are still awaiting the transformer for Clackamas River, with all wiring expected to be completed by December 8.

Safety & Equipment Training: We trained 9 team members in the safe operation of forklifts, scissor lifts, and pallet jacks. Expanding certifications beyond Andy and me continues to benefit district-wide coverage and efficiency.

Cost Savings & Inventory Update

~ Yang's Mandarin Chicken (Cost Reduction Strategy)

We partnered with a long-time broker who donated USDA pounds of chicken to our district at no cost. We paid for the processing to turn it into Yang's Mandarin Chicken, reducing the cost by \$34.00 a case.

~ Zee Zee Applesauce (Bulk Purchasing Savings)

Purchased by the pallet, allowing us to secure \$5.00 saving per case versus case-by-case ordering.

•~Emergency Food Inventory

Purchased to support operations during bad weather, delivery delays, or staffing shortages. We will begin the spin-down of this inventory on our menus in February.

~ Warehouse Storage & Distribution

All items are stored in the district warehouse and distributed to all schools as needed throughout the year.

~ Strategic Fall Purchasing

These early bulk purchases are intentional and help lower overall costs and stabilize menus throughout the entire school year.

~ USDA Entitlement Funds Update: We currently have \$9,521.84 remaining in USDA entitlement funds. These funds will be used to purchase fresh produce for our salad bars.
