Here are some examples of projects that we accomplished; painting the inside of the museum, taking down TV wire and poles, reworking the terraces at Gonde's Island, leveling and building a rock wall at Hager park, and various types of yard work for both the elderly and handicapped. It was a great day and our community embraced the efforts of our kids. Learning was a big part of the day and many of our students were exposed to things they have never experienced. This is an excerpt of a story that Mr. Morgan shared with me. He had a group of 7th graders on litter pickup working on the path that links HES to the city library. A student approached Mr. Morgan with a piece of garbage- the student told Mr. Morgan that this is a piece of garbage that I had dropped last night on his way home after school. Mr. Morgan asked the student- what do think of having to pick it up today as part of the "Mop Up?" The student replied- This day has made me realize how much garbage my friends and I throw on the ground and that he was going to make a better effort in not allowing this to happen either by himself or his friends. This was an example of the learning and self reflection of responsibility that happened across projects and grade levels. When thinking of what this day was about. Words really don't do justice to what it meant to many, but I did find a quote that helps with what I hope all of us get out of such an experience-

"When we commit to educating whole children within the context of whole communities and whole schools, we commit to designing learning environments that weave together the threads that connect not only math, science, the arts, and humanities, but also mind, heart, body, and spirit." Anonymous








Irrigon Elementary School
