7.c. Staff Housing Update

Eric Pingrey - The MDSD staff housing project's initial stage, covering infrastructure and an eight-unit building, is estimated at \$4,659,691, with the total cost for the entire project,

including 35 additional homes, projected at \$16,346,272; the proposed \$14 million bond leaves a \$2.3 million shortfall for the district, with costs at \$467,036 per unit and \$478 per square foot, aiming to complete the first eight units by winter 2024 and the remaining homes by late spring or early summer 2025 if construction begins this summer.

8.d. Addressing Overflow Classrooms/Staffing for 24-25 School Year

Motion to direct the superintendent to collaborate with administrators to manage enrollment in accordance with Policy 2240, addressing the issue while acknowledging existing financial constraints. Eric Pingrey - There are 84 fourth-grade students at BRMES and 34 at DES. Options to manage overflow include hiring staff at both locations or transferring students and possibly a staff member. With no Open Enrollment denials possible, solutions involve voluntary school changes or boundary adjustments. Option A moves ten DES fifth graders to BRMES, achieving a 23:1 student-teacher ratio. Option B moves ten BRMES fifth graders and a teacher to DES, also achieving a 23:1 ratio. Considerations include the impact on students who have long attended their home school and potential sibling transfers affecting K-4 class sizes. Budget challenges and funding changes necessitate careful consideration of staffing reductions at the K-5 level if overflow classes are not continued.
