Mr. Kurt Davey - PE/Health Teacher at Fleming Middle School is requesting out-of-state trip to New Mexico to receive training from the manufacturers 'Polar'. The offer the training in Albuquerque, New Mexico and in New York.

Over the last three years, the Fleming PE students have raised a substantial amount of money for a classroom set (35) of heart rate monitors.
