If the school district fails this indicator, the maximum points and highest rating that the school district may receive is 89 points, B = Above Standard Achievement. By reviewing this topic with the Board of Trustees within 120 days of adopting the 2019-2020 budget, the District will be in compliance with this particular indicator on the FIRST Rating.

Quarterly Growth Report 1st Quarter 2019 Rocky Gardner, Templeton Demographics presented the 1st Quarter Growth Report for 2019. Denton's unemployment rate is below 3% and has been the second fastest growing district in the Region 11 in the last 5 years. In the 1st quarter, Denton had the second most annual closings of any school district in DFW, more than Dallas and Frisco ISD. Within the district there were more than 570 new home starts in the first quarter of 2019, the most 1st quarter starts in more than 12 years. The Union Park Elementary zone has started more than 850 new homes in the last 12 months. Denton ISD has more than 4,100 lots available to build on.

Construction Report Elena Sandevole with Balfour Beatty provided new aerial views of Union Park Elementary. Parking lots and drives are 100 % complete. Roofing and masonry are 95 % complete. The main entrance steel is complete, 4th and 5th grade levels are in the process of being painted and corridor wall tile is complete in most areas. Geothermal piping is being installed in classroom wings. The gym will act as the storm shelter and will have a two-hour backup generator and meets the space requirement for approximately 800 + individuals. Solar panels will be installed in the coming months.
