DESOTO ISD PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICES POLICY

Texas House Bill 1481 restricts personal electronic device use during school hours in all K-12 public schools starting during the 2025-2026 academic year.

This policy:

- promotes focused learning environments
- reduces distractions in classrooms
- limits cyberbullying and social media misuse during school hours

DEVICES REFERENCED IN HB 1481:

Personal communication devices include:

- Cell Phones
- Tablets
- Smart Watches
- Radios or walkie-talkies
- Smart or Meta Glasses
- Headphones & Earbuds



 Any other electronic device capable of digital communication

PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICES POLICY

Devices must be turned off and out of sight prior to arrival to any DeSoto ISD campus and through dismissal.

District-established infractions for violation of personal communication devies on district campuses

VIOLATION CONSEQUENCES

1st Offense

- Device confiscated
- Parent/guardian must pick up from campus office

2nd Offense

- 3 days In-School Suspension (ISS)
- Device pickup by parent/guardian required

3rd Offense

- 5 days In-School Suspension (ISS)
- Device pickup by parent/guardian required

4th Offense

- DAEP placement for repeated
 Student Code of Conduct violations
- No cell phones allowed at DAEP





Effective September 1, 2023 – HB 114

Students caught possessing, using, or distributing e-cigarettes or vape products on school property or at school events must be placed in a Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP).

- Vaping is now treated with the same seriousness as drug or alcohol violations.
- No exceptions—this is a state-mandated law

Effective September 1, 2025 – SB 3

Possession, sale, or manufacture of THC-containing hemp products (including Delta-8 and Delta-9 vapes) becomes a criminal offense in Texas.

Offenders may face misdemeanor or felony charges.

DESOTO ISD IS COMMITTED TO STUDENT SAFETY

We encourage families to:

- Talk with your child about the dangers of vaping and THC products.

Beginning with the 2025–26 school year, DeSoto ISD will comply with Texas Senate Bill 10 (SB 10), which requires the Ten Commandments to be posted in a visible location in every classroom across public schools in Texas.

- Displays will follow mandated size, wording, and placement requirements
- No religious instruction will be provided alongside the displays
