- Burnside has been utilizing WINN times (What I Need Now) 30-minute intervention blocks for reading - for a couple of years now. This year, we have upped the ante and are having students in skill-based groups spread between the teachers. A major benefit this is that groups are formed across multiple classrooms allowing for more targeted skill groups than in an in-class model.

These skill-based groups allow for explicit instruction and immediate feedback for all students. Using Fastbridge to determine the skills and subskills students need will help the teacher know what explicit instruction to provide.

Twin Bluff

- Twin Bluff held its first dance on October 11th. We had 330 students in attendance and a great time was had by all.
- We hosted a Hispanic information night at Twin Bluff through Hispanic Outreach. We were introduced to families and answered questions that families had about SES, BES, and TBMS. Families were most concerned about the busing situation (late and safety).
