Thanked Dave for his dedication and commitment to students during his time on the Board. Dave shared that he enjoyed his terms on the board and the members he has served with. The District has a great Board and the District is in good shape.

The Board will follow a process to fill this vacancy by advertising for interested candidates. Candidates will be interviewed by a Board Committee of Melissa Brings, Patti Pokorney and Susan Lee. The Board will choose a replacement and make an appointment in April.

H. Superintendent Evaluation/Contract, Sue Lee

Evaluation was held on February 13th. Supt. Thielman is a leader with high moral

character, and conducts himself in a highly ethical manner. He has self confidence and enthusiasm in working with the Board. He has made strong community connections and is approachable. He has a finger on the pulse of the legislature. Supt. Thielman makes a great team with Gary Kawlewski for the finances of the district. Preboards are valuable and to be continued. Goals should be presented in the same format as the directors. Would like the Superintendent to organize two annual retreats for the Board.

A three-year contract is presented for 2013-16 which includes a salary increase, deletion of the cell phone allowance, and an increase of the 403B amount to equal the administrators.

Supt. Thielman commented – he is proud of the district accomplishments over the past three years. Looks forward to work on a Strategic Plan and follow-through from the Communications Audit.

I. Resolution Amending November 13, 2012 Intent Resolution

Bids were opened on February 21, 2013 for the Parkside Elementary Alternative Facilities Project. The final low responsible bid was higher than the project estimate by about \$384,000. This was found to be due to higher prices for steel and higher labor costs to get the project done on time. This resolution amends the amount to issue General Obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$3,855,000 pending approval of the Commissioner of Education. This is an \$11 increase on a \$200,000 property.

RESOLUTION AMENDING NOVEMBER 13, 2012 INTENT RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 877, State of Minnesota, as follows:

1. The intent resolution of the board adopted November 13, 2012, is amended to provide that the Bonds would be issued in the total aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$3,855,000. The issuance of the Bonds is hereby authorized, subject to the approval of the revised amount by the Commissioner of Education.

2. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause an amended notice substantially in the form of the Notice attached hereto as EXHIBIT A and incorporated herein by reference to be published as a legal notice one (1) time in the official newspaper of the District as soon as reasonably practicable after the adoption of this resolution. Any action of the administration to cause this Notice to be published taken prior to the adoption of this resolution is ratified and confirmed in all respects.

3. The provisions of the November 13, 2012 resolution and any actions taken thereunder shall remain in full force and effect except to the extent amended by this resolution.

Pokorney/Brings to approve

Discussion – Does this increase affect the Capital Outlay budget – yes, other projects will be delayed. Bids we received are good for 30 days. The materials order needs to be made by the end of March in order to keep the project on time. Will schedule a Special meeting on March 20, 2013 at 7:30 a.m. to approve the sale of the bonds. Motion carried 6-0

- B. 2nd Semester Class Size Report, Anita Underberg

Class sizes have remained very stable since the October 2012 report. Elementary - 24.28, Middle School - 29.87, High School - 30.61

There are 11 elementary classrooms with 30 or more students. There are class sizes as high as 35 in middle school Science, Math and Social Studies and class sizes at the high school of 39 in World Languages, 38 in Science and Social Studies and 37 in Math.
