

OFFICE MEMO

**Please notify the office with a note or phone call if your child is going to be absent from school (Sick, vacation etc..) Attendance is very important to your child's education. Please make appointments before or after school hours when possible

If your child needs to take **medicine at school it **MUST** be in its original container with the Doctor's directions how to dispense on it. A form is available in the office and must be filled out by the parent/guardian before any medicine can be given to your child. No child will be allowed to bring or take medicine home from school it must be given back to the parent. This is for the safety of your child as well as the other students and is state law.

**If you need your child to go home a different way then stated on your transportation form please call the office in the morning we will no longer be able to take changes after 1:00pm unless of an emergency. Please remember you may also send a note with your student. If your child is going to go home with another student we <u>MUST ALSO</u> have a note from that parent to allow this to happen. The office staff is very busy and does not have the time to call and make the arrangements, that is why we <u>MUST</u> have a call or note from both families.
