• Science curricular review

Classroom teachers in grades K-6 who teach science have been working their way through a review process. Curricular samples from four curriculum companies were sent to our school for review. Grade level staff have utilized a set of criteria to examine each curriculum to narrow down the field. After a quantitative and qualitative review, the top two curriculum will be compared and contrasted specifically with our Minnesota standards to determine our recommendation for the Systems Accountability Committee.

• Late Start for support staff:

Paraprofessional staff attended one of two staff development trainings. District nurse Michelle MacPherson led one training for staff who are asked to complete Third Party Billing processes at their buildings. Other district paraprofessionals completed a self-analysis using the Myers Briggs Personality inventory. The results of the inventory were used to reflect on how they can use this knowledge within their classroom assignments, working with both students and staff.
