So we are using our professional learning teams to analyze the data to help chart our path for the next several months.

Today, we met and discussed our scores and decided how we would look at our data. We will be specific in our interventions and we will use strand data to help us pinpoint specific areas that our kids need the most intervention with in order to be more successful. Our teams are collaborating on how to plan together and how to use each teacher's talents and successes to help grow others so over time we all have more tools to work with when teaching kids.

We hope in the end our test scores reflect this difficult journey we have taken this year as a school. I am so proud of my teachers and support staff for their efforts to work together for the common good! It's a joyful place for me to be as a principal.

I also want to thank our Superintendent and our directors for the very intentional work that has been done with us as instructional leaders. Each director has given us some specific training. Dave supported us in learning how to establish and lead professional learning teams (PLT's) in our schools. Debbie has provided outstanding training in how to effectively observe teaching so we can give well thought out feedback to our teachers to further impact their growth. Stephanie has helped us get a grant to begin using the Response to Intervention or RTI method that ties in the use of a strong core program with an effective, well thought out set of intervention and enrichment opportunities for students. I am thoroughly inspired and excited to have the opportunity to learn more so I can better serve my staff, students and parents.
