The work focuses on: Developing engaging, standards-aligned materials that promote critical thinking, depth, and complexity beyond on-level coursework. Ensuring the curriculum prepares students for Advanced Placement–level expectations in high school. Creating clear learning expectations for each unit in Advanced 7th- and 8th-grade Science and Social Studies, with aligned district assessments for implementation in 2026–27. At the middle school level, this committee's work has also led to the realignment of all core subjects to ensure coherence and rigor across grades. To support this alignment, all middle school honors courses will be renamed Advanced to better reflect their rigor and connection to high school Advanced Placement courses and exams.
