Meeting Conduct

(formerly Public Participation At Board Meetings)

All regular and special meetings of the Board will be open to the public. Because the Board desires to hear the viewpoints of citizens throughout the district, it will schedule one or more periods during each meeting for public participation. It may set a time limit on the length of this period and / or a time limit for individual speakers.

Comments and questions at a regular meeting may deal with any topic related to the Board's conduct of the schools. Comments at special meetings must be related to the call of the meeting.

1. Meeting Conduct

A. Meetings of the Board of Education shall be conducted by the Chairperson in a manner consistent with the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act and the adopted bylaws of the Board.

B. All Board meetings shall commence at, or as close as practicable to, the stated time, provided there is a quorum.

C. All regular and special Board meetings shall be guided by an agenda which will have been prepared and delivered in advance to all Board members and other designated persons.

D. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of the Board except as otherwise provided by these bylaws.

2. Smoking

A. Smoking will not be permitted in any room in which a meeting of the Board of Education is being conducted, nor during the time immediately prior to the meeting.

B. A sign notifying the public that no smoking is allowed in the place designated for the meeting will be prominently posted.

3. Procedures for Participation By Means of Electronic Equipment

A. Board members may participate in meetings by means of electronic equipment (e.g., telephone, video conference) under the conditions set forth herein. When such conditions are met, any Board member

44 participating by means of electronic equipment shall be counted for the
45 purpose of constituting a quorum. Conditions for participation are as
46 follows:

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- 48 1. The facility that is made available to the public that wishes to
49 attend the meeting must be located where the greatest number of
50 Board of Education members are located;
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 - 52 2. Any physical or demonstrable material that is used in the course of
53 the proceedings must be present in the place where the public is
54 located; and
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 - 56 3. All those in attendance at the meeting, at whatever location, must
57 be able to hear and identify all participants in the proceeding,
58 including their individual remarks and votes.

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60 B. When a Board member is participating in a meeting by means of
61 electronic equipment, the Chairperson shall take the necessary steps to
62 ensure that the three conditions enumerated above are met. In addition,
63 the Chairperson shall take the necessary steps to ensure that a Board
64 member participating by means of electronic equipment has adequate
65 opportunity to express himself/herself in Board discussion, including the
66 opportunity to take the floor and make motions.

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70 4. Public Address

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72 A. The Board may permit any individual or group to address the Board
73 concerning any subject that lies within its jurisdiction during a
74 portion of the Board's regular meetings so designated for such
75 purpose.

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77 (1) Three minutes may be allotted to each speaker, which may be
78 modified at the beginning of a meeting if the number of
79 persons wishing to speak makes it advisable to do so.

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81 (2) The Board Secretary shall act as timekeeper for the meeting, if
82 deemed necessary by the Chairperson.

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84 (3) No boisterous conduct shall be permitted at any Board of
85 Education meeting. Persistence in boisterous conduct shall be
86 grounds for summary termination, by the Chairperson, of that
87 person's privilege of address.

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89 (4) All speakers must identify themselves by name and address.]

Freedom of Information Commission Advisory Opinion #41 (April 9, 1980)

~~The Board Chairperson will be responsible for recognizing all speakers. To maintain proper order and to adhere to any set time limits, all speakers must properly identify themselves. Questions asked by the public will, when possible, be answered immediately by the Chairperson or referred to staff members present for appropriate reply. Questions requiring investigation will be referred to the Superintendent for consideration and later response.~~

~~Members of the public will only be recognized by the Chairperson as the Board conducts its official business at the discretion of the Board.~~
