Course Description:

This course is an introductory course into Animal Science. Areas of study include scientific investigations in Introduction to Animal Science, The Organisms, Cell Structure, Functions of the Cell, Animal Tissues, Systems and Organs, Genetics and Heredity, Breeding and Reproduction, Livestock Nutrition, Feeding Livestock, Animal Health, Livestock Diseases and Parasites, Animal Products, and the Scientific Method Term Project and Matrix.

Materials Required:

- 3-ring binder (2" preferred, minimum 1.5")
- Notebook
- Pen/Pencil
- Positive Attitude
- Appropriate clothes for labs

Note: Students in this course will be encouraged to utilize electronic devices during certain lessons throughout the semester. Students will be given advance notice when these devices, laptops, cell phones, etc., are permitted in class. Cell phones will **not** be permitted in the classroom unless under teacher direction.

Grading Policy

Grading will be based on the standard 100-percentile scale. Students will receive a letter grade based on their percentage of total available points in the class. Points will be based on completeness and quality of work.

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Tests/Quizzes:

Tests will be given at the end of each unit. Quizzes will be given randomly throughout each unit. Point values for tests and quizzes will vary. Possible District Formative Assessments will be given throughout the year but will not be used to calculate the student's test grade. A final will be given at the end of each semester and will be used in calculating the semester grade. The final will not affect the quarter grades.

<u>Labs:</u>

Students will perform multiple labs during each semester. It is important that the student complete ALL labs to pass the class with a satisfactory grade.

Participation:

Students must maintain a daily log to receive credit for this portion of their grade. If they are absent from class, the student will receive a zero for that day for participation. To make up an absence, the student must arrange a time with the teacher to come in before, after school or at lunch.

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Absent (Make-up work) Policy
