Purpose of Report

Denton Inquiry 4 Lifelong Learning (DI4LL) is a groundbreaking project with multiple learning space partners in Denton, Texas. Our long range plan is to produce a replicable model of a Pre-K-20 research initiative that is adaptable by other educational groups for improving student performance in research and critical thinking.

The purpose of this grant is to write a vertically aligned curriculum for inquiry skills from Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 20 (Graduate-level dissertations) which according to a review of the literature has not been done before. Our partners in the grant are UNT Libraries, UNT SLIS, TWU Libraries, TWU SLIS, and the Denton Public Library.

As we progress through the various stages of this project, members of the DI4LL Advisory Board have spoken at state, national, and international conferences, written articles in national publications, and gained the support of experts in the field. The Center for the International Scholarship in School Libraries (CISSL) at Rutgers University is interested in partnering with us and serving as the outside entity that will validate any research we gather.

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- social service agencies) in order to see what changes need to be made in order to address the needs of our patrons (at all levels served from birth to adult).
- To create a replicable model other communities could use to meet the needs in their community. Dean Halbert of the UNT Libraries said this study has the potential to be quoted in the literature as the "Denton Study."
