

## **FPC Allen Campus Board Report May 2025**

- The Allen Campus hosted another successful Pathway Scholarship fundraiser and silent auction in April raising \$4,500 this year.
- Perryton High School dual credit welders constructed a sign marking the entrance to Wolf Creek Park as one of several service projects completed this school year. The students have other signs they are working on that will also be for the Wolf Creek Park area. Kudos to the welding program!
- Christy Dovel, Laura McIntire, Mary Blackwell, and Cassi Laxton attended the ADN Pinning in Amarillo on May 8<sup>th</sup> to celebrate the RNEC graduates.
- The Allen Campus had a total of seventy-three graduates this year. The following is a breakdown of the completions:
  - 24 Students - Associate Degrees (1 Dual Credit from Perryton, 1 Dual Credit from Booker)
  - 9 Students - LVN
  - 14 Students - Diesel Mechanic (2 Dual Credit from Perryton)
  - 14 Students - Welding Dept. (5 Dual Credit from Perryton, 1 Dual Credit from TTAEC)
  - 12 Students - Cosmetology (6 Dual Credit from Perryton, 1 Dual Credit from TTAEC, 1 Dual Credit from Spearman)
- The annual North Plains Groundwater Conservation District's Make a Splash Water Festival was hosted by the Allen Campus on Thursday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. Area fourth graders attended the festival to learn about water conservation through sessions, games, and activities in the day long event.
- Ochiltree County Friends of Scouting selected Frank Phillips College Allen Campus as the 2025 Honoree for the community organization that is making an impact in future leadership. The college was chosen primarily for its commitment to offer additional CTE and CE programs for students locally in the expansion of the Workforce Development Center in Perryton.

- The Allen Campus hosted ALERRT – Level I Training for law enforcement on May 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>.
