My son, with the knowledge that he gained from the electrician CTE program and being in <u>constant</u> intermittent contact with his dad, was able to <u>not only</u> connect individual generators to homes <u>to</u> and provide heat.He also was there to assist <u>with</u> connecting a big generator to the tribal building. Micarlo worked relentlessly into the night enduring the cold weather to ensure that there was a heat source.

My husband and I are in Anchorage for medical. We were not home during the blackout.

Micarlo would go find an internet connection to communicate with his dad, get the instructions that he needed then carry out the task. Once the task was completed, he would call his dad back to let him know.

An image that will be forever ingrained in my memory is <u>that</u> one of a very proud father telling Micarlo's grandfather what he had accomplished.
