- helping them find their own strengths and unique abilities.

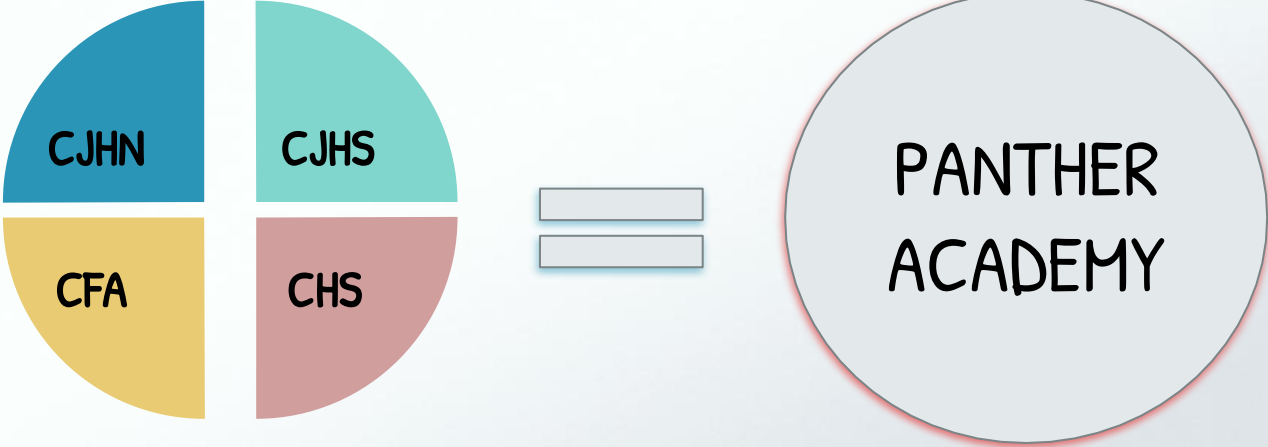
What is Cabot Panther Academy?

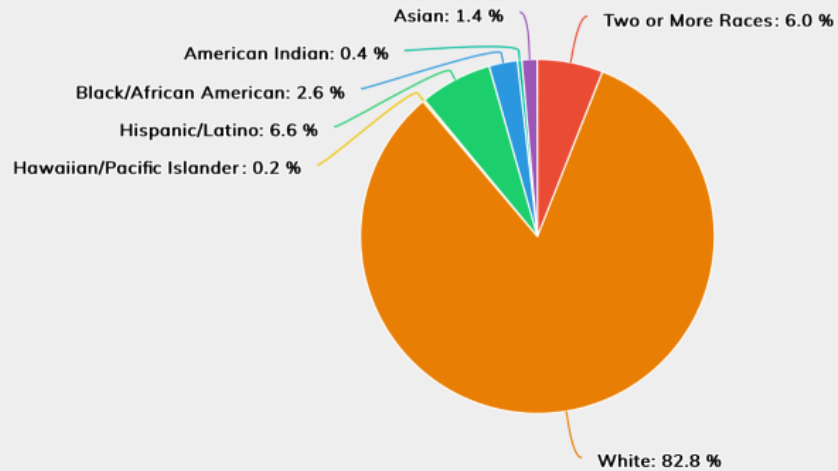

DISTRICT DEMOGRAPHICS



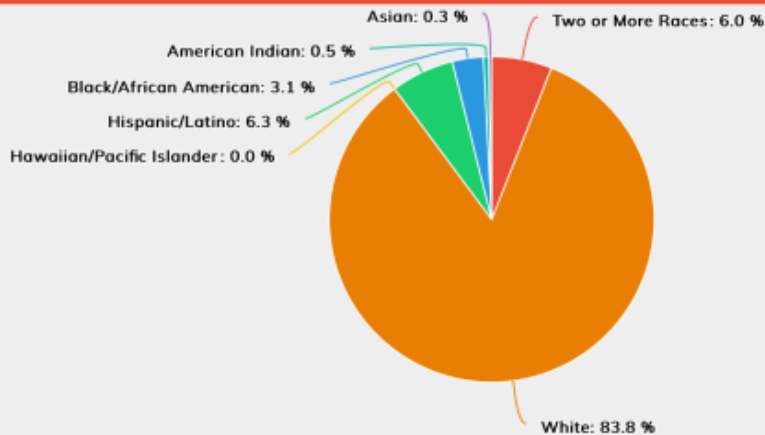

2020-2021 CABOT PANTHER ACADEMY DEMOGRAPHICS



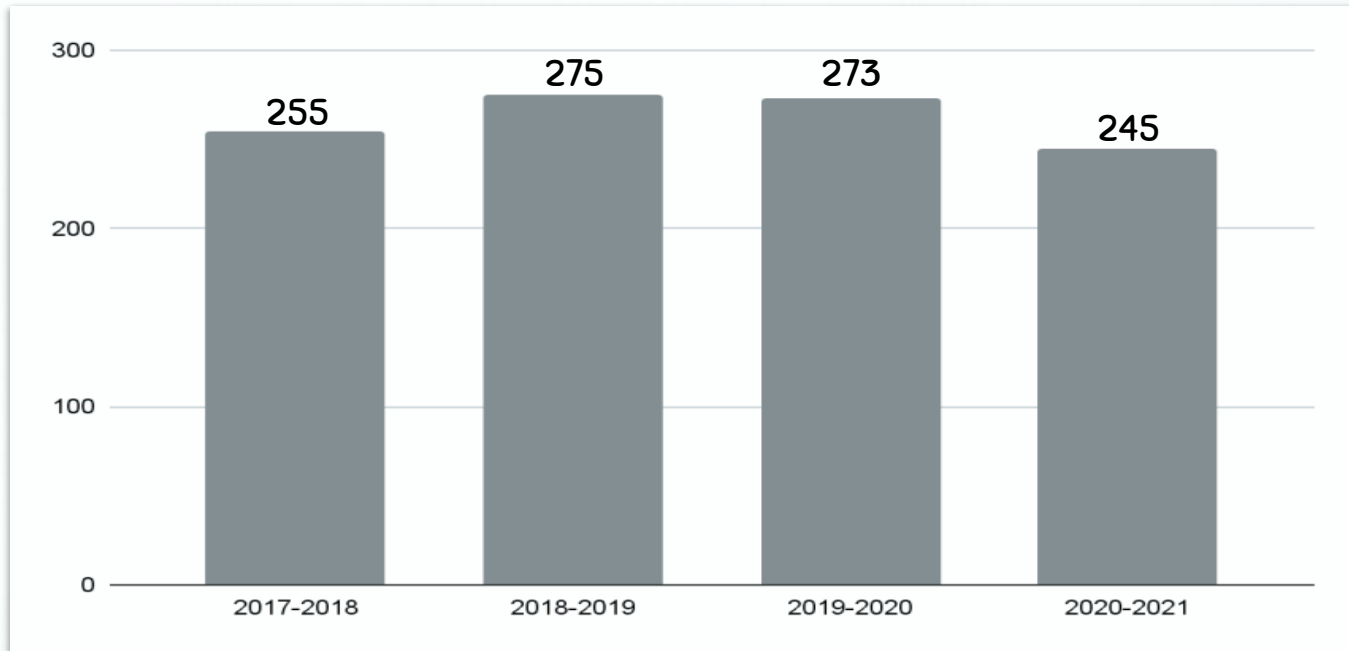

SMART Goal 1	Metric	Evaluation of Goal
Increase school's average ACT Composite scores	School's average ACT composite score of 20 or higher.	Unfortunately, our school did not meet this goal. Indeed as the average composite scores for both our state and our district decreased over the past five years, it is not unique for our school's average to drop. In addition, neither the average of students in our state nor the district was 20.0. With that in mind, the goal of 20 as an average for students in an at-risk school may have been too lofty a goal to set. We would like to continue to use the ACT Composite score in the future, but an overall average of 20 may be too high a goal to set given the trend over the past five years.





In the chart below we've tracked not only the percentage of students who demonstrate readiness in Math on the ACT Aspire, but also the number of students tested in each grade level. With our low total number of students as well as their respective at-risk situations, we anticipate there always being a high level of volatility in assessment percentages. For those reasons, as well as our desire to best prepare our students for post-secondary success, we will be modifying this goal for the future.</p>

With our low total number of students as well as their respective at-risk situations, we anticipate there always being a high level of volatility in assessment percentages. 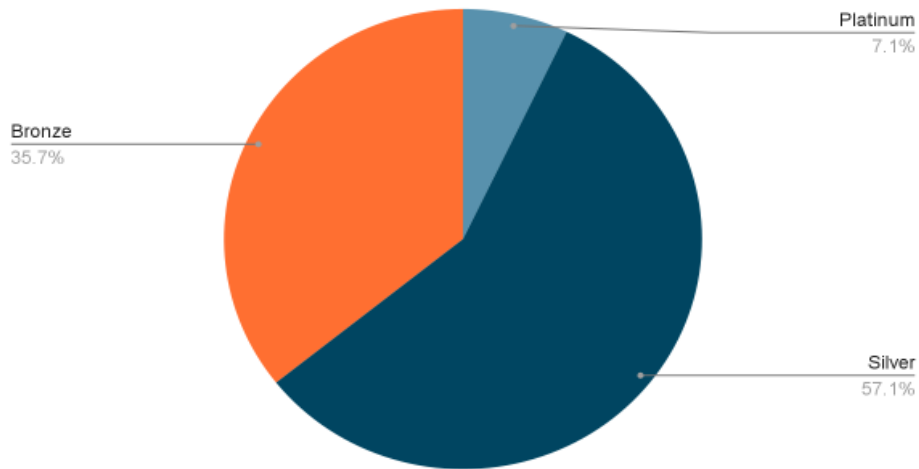

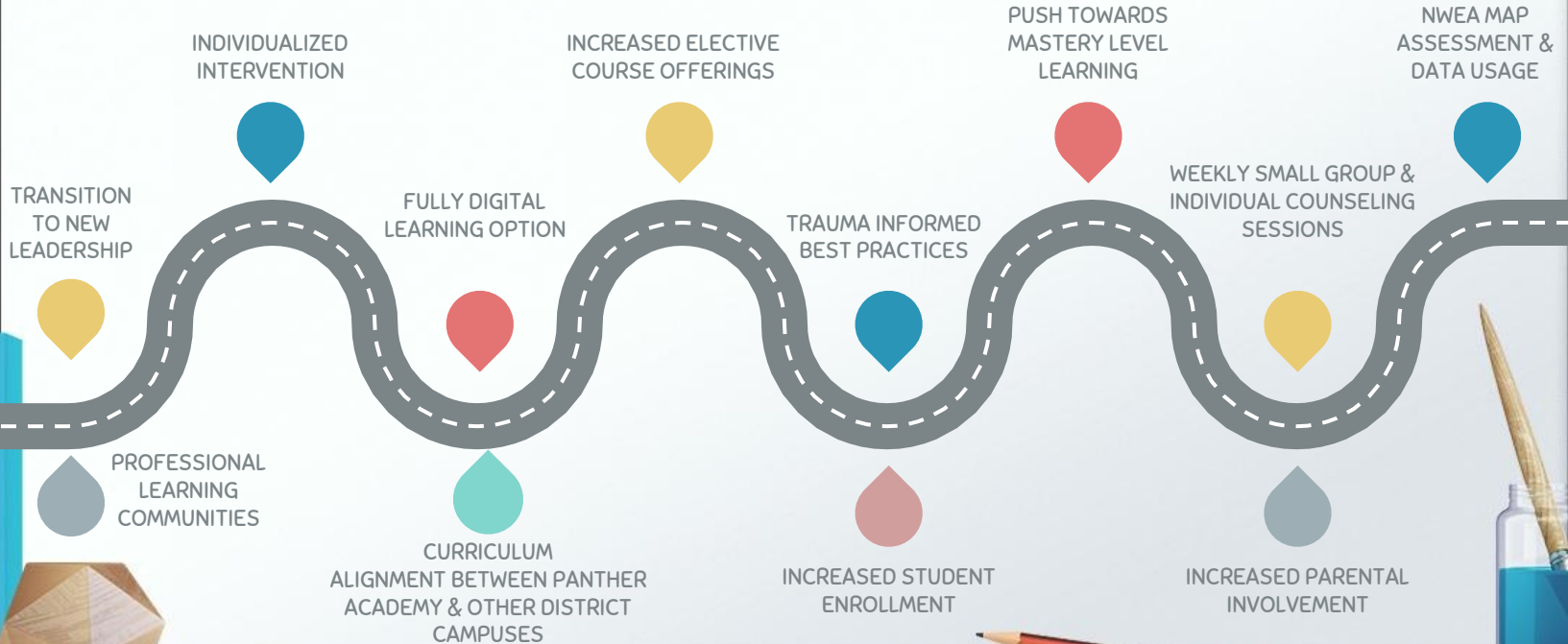
