Annual Division 22 Report:

Under the new Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) school districts are required to report to their school board and communities the district's status for being in compliance with all Standards for Public Elementary and Secondary Schools (Division 22 Standards) set by Oregon Administrative Rules. The following summary highlights Morrow County School District's compliance in meeting all of the standards.

Highlights:

Instructional Materials Adoption: MCSD continues to budget so that the district is able to adopt curriculum materials K-12 on the cycle established by the state. For the 18-19 school year we are working through the Social Studies curriculum adoption. In December teachers and administrators began meeting to review current instructional practices and standards. They will conduct a needs assessment for instruction and materials as well as begin reviewing curriculum materials. In January and February they will review multiple presentations from textbook companies as well as review materials in each building prior to preparing a proposal for the School Board in March. The spring will be spent aligning the new curriculum and new social studies standards and learning the new resources.

District Instructional Focus: Our focus continues to be on aligning content standards and instructional curriculum to best support student learning. The K-6 classrooms have focused on identifying the priority standards in Language Arts and Math and strengthening instructional strategies that are research based and proven to support high achievement. The 7-12 teachers have also identified priority standards within their content and are working on strengthening instructional strategies that will support students in rigorous learning.

Dyslexia Training: Senate Bill 1003 requires that each school district begin screening all kindergarten through 1st grade students for risk factors tied to dyslexia. We have begun screening our students, and will begin sharing the information with parents around these results this spring. The team elected to use DIBELS as a monitoring tool, which serves a dual purpose of providing additional data on student progress with literacy skills.

Alternative Education Programs: Morrow Education Center has transitioned into a K-12 alternative school beginning the 18-19 school year. It houses both our online program and the alternative program where students can continue working toward a diploma or a GED.
