

Increased Health and Safety Measures

- EAPs—updated, rehearsed, and accessible—so in a moment of crisis, our coaches, trainers, and staff are ready
 - Continue to double down on heat protocols, closely monitoring WBGT to make realtime decisions that prioritize hydration breaks, shaded areas, and practice modifications.

Strengthened Accountability Measures

To ensure that every athlete meets eligibility requirements the athletic department has heightened requirements and provided additional training—to include more stringent academic tracking, residency and transfer verification— submitted and verified before play begins.

Student-athletes whose coaches scored 80+ in key connection themes missed 12 fewer days of school annually.

Denton ISD had 43% of coaches with an overall average of 80% or more. Overall average is defined as averaging all 6 themes scores together
