Principal & Director Reports May 2011

AC. Houghton Elementary

Kindergarten Screening: On May 5, we screened prospective kindergartners for the coming school year 11-12. We screen between 40 and 50 students, which is a good predictor of having a normal size kindergarten in the coming school year of approximately 70 students. This has been our stable size for several years. The screening process allows us to examine early learning skills of entering students, which in turn allows us to make up class sizes that are balanced using student current abilities, boy/ girl balance, ethnic balance, etc.

Bear Day/Night: On May 18 we will hold our annual Bear Day/Night. We have a reading program, Accelerated Reader, that functions all year with students working towards goals each quarter. The last goal that students are working toward is making the Bear Day activities for kindergarten and first and second graders and to make the nighttime activities, Bear Night, for third graders. This year we will balance the students between day and night. Second graders will change from activities right after school to activities that will take place between 6:30 PM and 9 PM. Only third graders will continue to stay overnight as we still feel that second graders are a little young to do that.

Oaks Testing: We have the last round of Oaks state assessment underway. We have worked very hard over the last three months, since the mid-year Oaks, to prepare our students to have as many as possible pass the Oaks state standards for math and reading.

Spring Concerts: The concert and program for kindergarten and first grade will be May 10 at 7 PM. The spring concert and program for grades second and third will be May 12 at 7 PM. Teachers have been working hard with Mrs. Marquardt , our music teacher, to prepare for these programs.

Anti-Bullying Effort: The day of May 9 will be a special anti-bullying focus day at ACH. We have a special speaker and special anti-bullying focus materials that we will be giving to each of our students.

Heppner Elementary School

It is a privilege to report the recent happenings of Heppner Elementary School. It is hard to believe that May has already arrived. Our current enrollment at HES is 187 students and our current attendance percentage for the year is 96.1%. We recently began the third round of OAKS testing at HES and I am happy to report that most of our students have met or exceeded the benchmarks for their grade. We will continue working hard to get the few remaining HES students over the benchmark hump during this third and final round of testing.

April was full of many exciting events which took place at HES, with the highlight being the "Honor Card Assembly" which was held on April 7th where 108 HES students received Honor Cards and Certificates for the third quarter. Honor Cards are given to students that maintain positive grades and behavior during each quarter of the school year. HES students also performed very well at the district sponsored math contest held at IJSHS on April 21st.

With the fourth quarter well under way we are rapidly approaching the end of the school year. Our 25 sixth grade students headed for the hills this week for Tupper Outdoor School. Other noteworthy events which will be taking place this month include; The HES/HHS Spring Concert on Wednesday May 18th at 6pm and Memorial Day Holiday on Monday, May 30th.

District Maintenance Update: In addition to the HES Report - I would also like to report that Apollo recently completed the spring check for the cooling side of all of our buildings HVAC systems. The 2011-2012 maintenance budget has been completed. Jan and I are working with head custodians to complete all remaining projects that were planned for the current school year.

Our GEAR-UP team returned from our annual SUCCESS planning and training retreat in Bend excited about what we have been doing and what we would like to offer our students next year as part of our GEAR-UP program. We had the pleasure of hearing from John O'Neil the former principal of Forest Grove High School which has been recognized as a National Model School, about the turnaround success they experienced between 2001 and 2008. His presentation was exciting for us, because as one team member commented after hearing his presentation, "Those are the things we're starting to do!"

We used the time and training at the retreat to build the framework for our year 4 plan. We plan to continue the college visitations, career presentations, and transitions camps. We also plan to expand our current financial aid nights to a monthly "College 101" series for the parents of students of every age attending our school. We also plan to expand use of the Path to Scholarships curriculum from a pilot in a single 9th grade advisory to full use in the 9th and 10th grade advisories.

Knight Klean-Up Day

We will be holding our annual Knight Klean-Up day on May 5th. In all, we will have seventeen advisory groups out in the community doing a variety of jobs assisting the elderly, parks and recreation, ACH, and the city of Irrigon. This provides students the opportunity to give something back to their community. During the second half of the day the Oregon National Guard will be brining in their rock wall and inflatable obstacle course. We will also have CO2 car races in the gymnasium courtesy of Mr. Hunt as well as a variety of outdoor activities. This is always been a huge hit with students. A special thanks to Mrs. Luna and our Key Club for coordinating all of the activities that day.

Senior Career Visitation

Before the year runs out, we will be taking our senior class to Intel and St. Vincent Providence Medical Center. Intel and Providence are two of Oregon's largest employers, and each tour will present our senior class members with information and strategies for making smart, informed choices within their post secondary careers. For instance, what classes and experiences should they seek while in college, what fields should they pursue within the military, or what kinds of initiatives should they take on in an entry-level job? Providence will also provide our seniors with a Mock Interview and feedback opportunity as well.

Looking forward to next year, we are working with staff members to improve our existing programs and scale up our successful pilot programs to school-wide efforts beginning next year. Our JH intervention program is showing a lot of promise, as are our extension classes and several of our college and career readiness programs.

With four weeks until graduation, we are entering the cram phase of the school year. This not only applies to the potential graduates, but also to the other students attempting to make up credits to return to their resident school. We are pleased this year with the progress which has been made with accountability with the students, demonstrated by their continued pursuit of increased attendance.

As stated earlier in the year, the plateau in the number of students has happened and we are hovering just above 100 students enrolled. Due to the time of year, we have cut off new referrals for the year, as a student would not be able to gain any academic skills/credits with the time remaining. Additionally, with the higher numbers, our Special Education Teacher has fully immersed herself into creating a program for the students on IEP's. The students, staff and parents alike have been extremely pleased with her ability to come mid-year and help with these students. Lastly, I would like to say that we have had a great year at Morrow Education Center and we are looking forward to helping students finish the year on a high note.
