The above data reflects enrollment numbers across programs in the district. We did see an increase in the economically disadvantaged population at the high school campus, which is good because it more accurately reflects the actual population. We collect this data on the free and reduced lunch applications as I have shared with you in the past. This increase raises our percentage to 48% and keeps our high school campus from losing Title I status unless something changes in the rules between now and when we submit our grant application next spring.

The district failed to meet safeguards in the state accountability system in the areas of performance on state assessment in reading and math for our ELL and Special Education populations. Also, we were staged in PBMAS Bilingual/ESL in performance on state assessment in reading and math for our ESL population grades 3-8. The district is required to develop improvement activities but does not have to submit the improvement plan to TEA unless requested. At this time, the TEA secure website does not have our district assigned a reviewer for our plans. The improvement activities in the attached plan closely mirror the improvement activities from the elementary campus accountability plan that we did submit because the issues are the same. The district improvement activities are also included in our District Improvement Plan that will be submitted for your approval at a later date.
