David Caviness stated that based on the Texas Education Agency's September 17, 2021, Public Health Guidance that provides "Per GA-38, school systems cannot require student or staff to wear a mask," and he motioned that the Coppell Independent School District rescind its temporary mask requirement for its students, staff, and visitors, until further legal requirements, options, or clarifications related to local control as a result of ongoing state and federal litigation. Manish Sethi seconded the motion.

Tracy Fisher motioned to amend Trustee Caviness's motion to rescind mask for secondary students and to leave the mandate in place for elementary students. The amendment did not receive a second

The original motion on the floor from Trustee Caviness was put to a vote and the motion passed 5-1-1. Trustee Fisher voted in opposition and Trustee Biswas abstained from the vote.

PUBLIC HEARING

A public meeting was held to discuss the Coppell Independent School District's state financial accountability rating. Diana Sircar, Chief Financial Officer, presented information regarding the school FIRST (Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas) rating for 2020-2021. Coppell ISD received an "A" Superior rating with the maximum points of 100 for their FIRST 2020-2021 results.

No citizen expressed an interest in speaking regarding the rating and financial performance of the district.

Dr. Angie Brooks, Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction, provided a presentation on Social and Emotional Learning for the district and an Accessibility and 2016 Bond Project update was provided by Dr. Dennis Womack, Chief Operations Officer and Debbie Gauntt, Director of Intervention Services

CONSENT

Tracy Fisher requested that item #4 be pulled from the consent agenda for separate consideration. Nichole Bentley seconded the motion.

Tracy Fisher made a motion to approve the following consent agenda items removing item #4, Adopt resolution recommitting Operating Fund Balance for separate consideration:

- 1. Approve minutes of the regular Board meeting held on September 27, 2021 and Workshop held on October 18, 2021
- 2. Approve monthly budget amendments for October 2021
- 3. Approve Financial Report for September 2021
- 4. Adopt resolution recommitting Operating Fund Balance
- 5. Approve the Superintendents recommendations for the employment of professional personnel

Anthony Hill seconded the motion. The motion carried 6-0. Trustee Walker was not present when the vote was taken.

Tracy Fisher motioned to approve the resolution to commit \$3,221,935 in Operating Fund balance for 2020-2021. President Nichole Bentley seconded the motion and the motion passed 7-0.

David Caviness motioned to adopt the 2021-2022 Campus Improvement Plans as presented. The motion was seconded by Tracy Fisher. The motion passed 7-0.

A motion to adopt the renewed and revised local District of Innovation Plan as presented was made by Anthony Hill and seconded by Tracy Fisher. The motion passed 7-0.

David Caviness made a motion to approve North Star Builders Group as the Construction Manager-at-Risk as specified in the Request for Proposal for the fee of 2.25 percent of the construction services provided. The motion was seconded by Manish Sethi and passed 7-0.

A motion to approve Hellas Construction, Inc. to update and replace the recommended baseball and softball field improvements as presented was made by Tracy Fisher and seconded by Anthony Hill. The motion passed 7-0.

David Caviness made a motion to temporarily postpone making any changes to the Board Operating Procedures until April 25, 2022. Manish Sethi seconded the motion.

Tracy Fisher motioned to amend the motion on the floor to postpone possible action on the Board Operating Procedures to the next regular meeting, November 29, 2021. The motion was seconded by Dr. Neena Biswas and the amendment passed 4-3.

A vote was taken on the amended motion to temporarily postpone any changes to Board Operating Procedures from April 25, 2022 to November 29, 2021. The motion passed 4-3.
