What is Assistive Technology? Why is it important?













Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Mandates:

- 300.308 Assistive Technology (Public Law, 2004)
 - (a) Each public agency shall ensure that assistive technology devices or assistive technology services, or both, as those terms are defined in 300.5-300.6 are made available to a child with a disability if required as part of a child's IEP to achieve FAPE.

Assistive Technology Device

 Any item, piece of equipment, or product system, whether acquired commercially off the shelf, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve functional capabilities of children with disabilities.



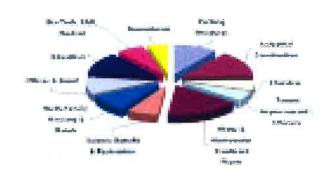




Assistive Technology Services

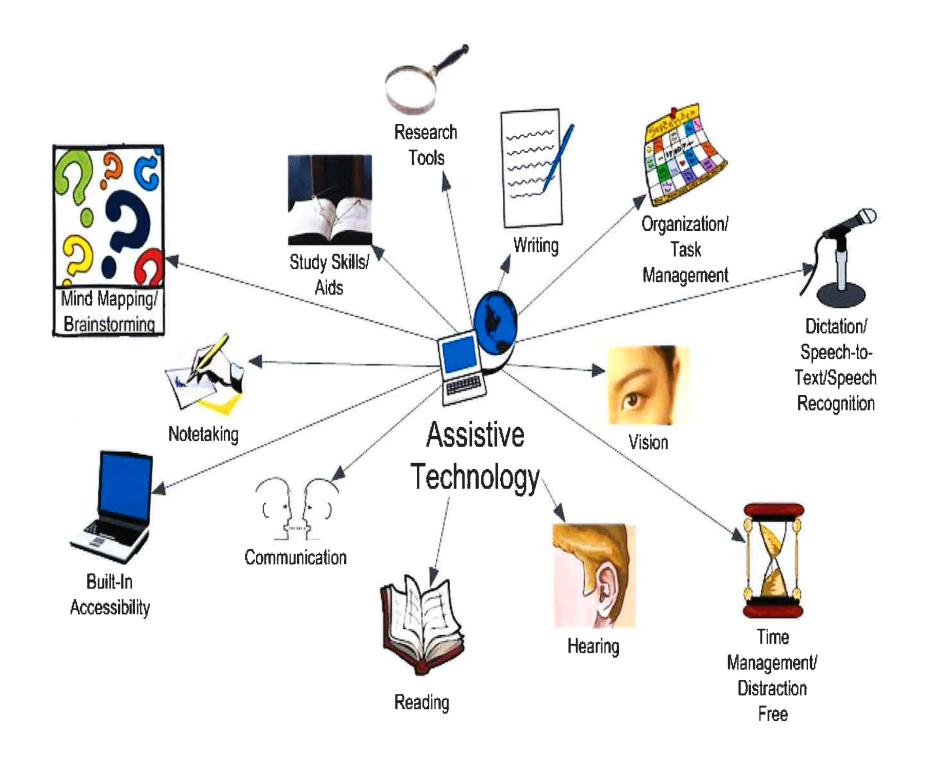
- Assistive technology service means any service that directly assists a child with a disability in the selection, acquisition, or use of an assistive technology device.
 - §300.6 Assistive technology service

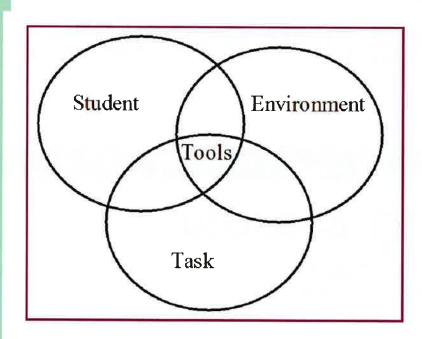

- A process of matching the student with a disability to the:
 - Tasks and activities the student needs to be able to do
 - Environments in which the tasks can occur, and
 - Ways to achieve goals and overcome barriers through the use of devices, tools, or services. (Zabala, 2003)
