Purpose of Report:

This report is provided to the Board of Trustees as a summary of the Ann Windle School for Young Children (AWSYC) Head Start Administrative Requirements and Standards from section 644 of the Head Start Act.

Objectives:

Annually, each Head Start Agency must report the following information from the most recently concluded fiscal year:

- The total amount of public and private funds received and the amount from each source.
- An explanation of budgetary expenditures and proposed budget for the fiscal year.
- The results of the most recent review of the financial audit.

Operational Impact:

AWSYC is funded by a Federal Grant in the amount of \$1,322,869. The grant requires a local match of 20% or \$330,717. A total from all sources during the 2016-2017 school year for matching dollars is \$918,612. The award for 2016-2017 reflects a COLA (cost of living adjustment) increase over the previous year in the amount of \$23,016.

Results:

As a result of AWSYC designation as a Head Start Program, Denton ISD is able to serve 193 students in a full day Head Start program implemented by 11 highly qualified/certified, degreed teachers. The program includes a management staff providing oversight in the areas of child development and education, health services, nutrition services, family and community partnerships and disability services.
