Background and Rationale:

Senator Joan Huffman was first elected to the Texas Senate in 2008 and has been re-elected six times. In this time she has served Texas Senate District 17, which initially contained our Richmond and Sugar Land campuses, and now after the recent redistricting, contains our Wharton and Bay City campuses. During the last Legislative Session Senator Huffman was instrumental in supporting a special request posed by President Betty McCrohan for a \$2 million earmark to the state budget for the creation of a trade school in Bay City. The Wharton County Junior College Trade School at Bay City is near completion and a grand opening for the facility is being planned for early 2025.
