
Principal's Corner

As we resume classes after the holidays, we are reminded that the month of January represents the midway point of the 2015-16 school year. Even though there are grades issued each quarter, the semester grade is the one that goes on the transcript, which then becomes the permanent record. Our first semester ends on February 4th this year. It is important to recognize that the permanent record is what graduation is linked to as well as what colleges and scholarship and other financial aid organizations receive- so it is vital that your son/daughter does their very best in getting caught up if they are behind during the month of January. This starts with attendance. In order to achieve at the level he/she is capable of, they must attend school each day and arrive to class on time. As adults, our employers require this of us. If you think of Hidden Valley High School as an "employer", which we are for the four years of your son's/daughter's high school education- regular attendance (92% or higher) is not only important, but it is necessary. A student missing too much school will be in danger of losing credit for the class, regardless of the grade the student has earned. Please consider tracking your student on the web-portal in regards to attendance and grades. This tool is a great way to start a conversation around the dinner table in the evening with you son/daughter.

The end of the first semester will culminate with the administration of semester exams on February 3rd and 4th, 2016. The examination schedule will be as follows: Wednesday the third we will have 1st, 2nd, and 3rd period reviews followed by 1st, 2nd, and 3rd period finals. 4th period review will end our day on Wednesday. Thursday the fourth will start with the 4th period final followed by 6th and 7th period reviews. We will finish our finals schedule with the 7th period final at the end of the day. Examinations will take place during this schedule with approximately 70 minutes to take exams with reviews being 25 minutes. On February 5th there will be no school for students, as it is a teacher workday to correct finals and complete first semester grades. If schools are closed due to inclement weather prior to or during the examination dates, the above schedule may be subject to change.

Students and parents are reminded that semester exams are an important part of assessing a student's skills. Grades are derived on the basis of numerical averages and the semester exam may have a major impact on the student's overall semester grade. As a result, parents are encouraged to closely monitor their youngster's preparation for semester exams as well as their daily attendance on exam dates. Students are to remain in the assigned area during the entire examination period, no early releases during exams. Strong academic performance during this crucial period of the school term will help to ensure a more successful school year for all of us.

New Oregon Promise Helps Pay for Community College

The state is launching its Oregon Promise program—offering new high school graduates and GED recipients an opportunity to have some or all of their community college tuition covered. Grants are for students entering a community college in Oregon in Fall 2016.

You may qualify if your

- Graduate from an Oregon high school or complete the GED in Spring/Summer 2016
- Have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher
- Have been an Oregon resident for at least 12 months prior to enrolling in community college

Steps to take:

- Apply for the Oregon Promise between November 1, 2015 and March 1, 2016, including:
 - Complete the Oregon Promise application (online or written)
 - Submit your high school transcript or GED scores
 - Complete the FAFSA or its approved alternative
- Once approved, Enroll in an Oregon community college within six months of graduating high school or completing the GED (Fall 2016)—and accept all state and federal grants
