When you log into the Home Access Center, you will see a row of buttons at the top that looks like the image below:

If you click on "Grades," you will see any report card grades that have been entered by your child's teacher. Teachers complete grade reports halfway through the $trimester, and then again at the end of the trimester. However, you can also see how your student is doing on their daily classwork. ACCESS Testing will begin on January 21, 2025.

This important assessment provides key information for further class selection guidance and supports needed for students.

ACCESS Testing is almost here!

What is ACCESS?

ACCESS is the English proficiency test. It measures the level of academic English a student knows. The test has four different tests: Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking.

Who takes ACCESS?

Why do they take it?

When your child was registered for school it was marked "yes" for other than English spoken in the

When do they take it?
The test is taken in January and February. The scores are sent to the district in the Spring.

When does my child stop taking the test?

If your child still takes the ACCESS test

they will be reviewing last year's scores

and goal setting for the upcoming test

during their Advisory class.

Goal setting sheet, High School Trajectory,

Please encourage your child to practice

Updates From the Math Classes at LMS!



6th Grade Math Update

In 6th grade Math, we have been busy working through our first two modules this trimester. The first module that students worked on was based on Ratios. Students worked hard to understand how to use tape diagrams and tables to solve ratio problems. We also spent a lot of time focusing on unit rate and what item is the better buy. The second module in 6th grade is quickly coming to an end. This module focuses on

in 6th grade is quickly coming to an end. This module focuses on Arithmetic Operations. We started the module by dividing fractions using tape diagrams and then moved to being able to do this algebraically. Students then moved on to adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals. Finally, the module concluded with discussing least common multiple and greatest common factor.

Looking ahead, we will be taking our Winter MAP test the week after winter break. Please ask your child about their MAP goals. It is very important that we continue to have conversations based around goal setting and growth that students are making. These are conversations that we have almost daily during class, but continuing the conversation at home is equally important. Please reach out to your child's math teacher if you have any questions about MAP scores or goal setting.

7th Grade Math Update

Our seventh-grade mathematicians have been making great progress in building their math skills! Currently, we are focusing on solving equations and applying our understanding of rational numbers—including negatives, fractions, and decimals—to solve both equations and inequalities. In addition to our in-class work, students are using IXL as a personalized learning tool. Each week, they complete a diagnostic test (about 10 questions) that generates recommended skills for them to practice, helping to boost their diagnostic scores and overall math abilities. Each student has set a personal goal for their IXL diagnostic score, and they can also work on specific IXL skills aligned with their MAP scores. IXL also includes an IAR test preparation component, which will help students get ready for the IAR test in March. Homework is assigned weekly and focuses on reinforcing skills covered in class so be on the lookout for these assignments!

8th Grade Math Update

Our year in 8th grade math started off with a focus on geometry as students learned how things move through a series of transformations: translations, reflections, rotations and dilations. Students are currently working on modeling and solving problems algebraically. We are building on skills from 6th and 7th grade to advance to solving multi-step equations and systems of equations.

Throughout the year and especially as we close out the first trimester, students are tracking their progress on IXL, grades, and NWEA MAP scores. We're celebrating growth, identifying strengths, and making place to focus on our grees of greatest



need. Students are able to identify their individual strengths and areas of need through IXL and work on those independently or with a small group.

We are also focused on language, yes language in math!
Students are applying problem solving skills to find an answer
AND providing an explanation verbally or in writing. If students
can explain a concept to a peer, that is mastery.




