## Community Education Program Program Report October 2012

- Community Education is working with Aunt Martha's Youth Service Center and DCFS to help recruit foster families for the surrounding Harvey Area. Aunt Martha's Foster Care agency is located at the former Kich School in Harvey. Ms. Bolton has been working with Licensing Specialist Deiridia Hester to help kick off an event to allow parents in stable homes to care for children in Home –of Relative, Specialized and SASSY foster care programs. Ms. Hester wants to offer foster parent training classes and continuing education classes here in Harvey School District 152. The target date for a foster parent class in December.
