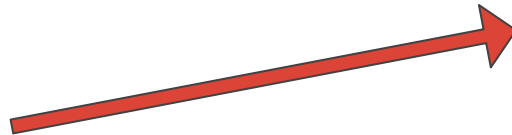

Board Update – Principal's Report

Rationale For Schedule Exploration:

- As we continue to plan strategically for the future, we are exploring different schedule options for grades 7-12.
 - This exploration is driven by three primary needs:
 - Enhancing the student experience at Roseau High School
 - Planning responsibly for long-term enrollment trends
 - Adjusting to staffing loss (ELA, Science, Social) as current budget does not allow rehiring

Roseau School District - Enrollment Trends

Currently, we are seeing a decline in enrollment at the K–6 level, which will eventually impact secondary enrollment. As these trends progress, we anticipate the need to transition the high school to three sections in core content areas.

- The key question guiding this exploration is:
 - How do we sustain robust options, electives, and student supports while responsibly right-sizing due to lower enrollment?

Synopsis of Trimester Schedule



After careful analysis, transitioning from a semester schedule to a trimester model is viable under our the current high school staffing structure. With existing staffing levels, a trimester schedule can be implemented without compromising course access or student programming while enhancing the student experience.

However, if early staffing reductions are anticipated due to budget constraints, the recommendation is to remain on the current semester model. Implementing a trimester schedule requires stability and clarity in staffing assignments to ensure equitable course offerings, manageable class sizes, and a balanced master schedule. At this time, potential staffing reductions introduce uncertainty that would significantly limit our ability to design and sustain an effective trimester model.

Synopsis: The 6 period day with advisory is the most feasible daily schedule for our current high school staffing model and course offerings. The increase in instructional minutes (8500-9180) in a 6 period day adds approx. 12 additional instructional days for year long courses. Alternatively, there is a loss of 44 instructional days for courses offered 2 out of 3 trimesters.

- Available sections (10) were applied to Media Productions, ESL and Spanish to be year long courses.
- Additional sections applied to CIHS
- 6 available sections remain to lower class sizes or create additional electives



Unintended Consequences

Unintended Consequences:

- Graduation requirements would need to change
- Summer Curriculum work / budget available to do this work
 - a. Creating new elective curriculum
 - b. Realignment of courses
 - c. Creating advisory content / structure
- Elementary on a trimester grading schedule
- Elementary lunch schedules adjusted

Moving Forward

- In summary, a trimester schedule remains a strong instructional option if staffing levels are maintained until 2030-31 school when lower class sizes enter Roseau High School. A clear and confirmed picture of budget impacts and potential reductions is essential before moving forward. Until that clarity is established, maintaining the semester schedule is the most responsible and stable path for students and staff.

Pros and Cons of Trimester

Pros:

- Students are taking fewer classes at one time
- Increase in course variety/electives and/or opportunities for interventions
- Credit recovery - Potential to create credit recovery classes
- Long-term viability / declining enrollment
- Increase in instructional days in ELA, math, and science (~11 days)
- Increase in guidance counselor support
- Opportunity to build in math / reading interventions
- CIHS added back to ELA

Cons:

- Change of pace (same amount of material covered in shorter period of time / longer class period)
- Instructional gap (when a core course has a trimester "off")
- Loss of instructional minutes in social studies for grades 9-12
- Loss of instructional minutes in grades 11-12 (6120 vs. 8600)
