## b. Report 63-70 E-Rate Structured Cabling and Structured Fiber Cabling: 2025-26 E-Rate, 20% from the Bond

- This project will cover replacing structured cabling (standardized system of organizing and installing the physical infrastructure for telecommunications and data transfer in a building or campus) and structured fiber cabling (designing and installing fiber optic cable systems to support high-speed data, voice, and video communication across a building or campus) for the following schools
  Structured Cabling: Birney K-8, Levey Middle School, Thompson K-8, Stevenson Elementary, Vandenberg World Cultures Academy. Structured Fiber Cabling: Southfield A&T, Birney K-8, Bussey Center, Kennedy Learning Center, Levey and Vandenberg. We are utilizing the E-Rate program for this project, which will allow us to receive up to 80% back on this project. Nerds Xpress provided the lowest and complete bid for both projects. Structured Cabling: \$28,248.43 (20% of \$141,242.15). Structured Fiber Cabling \$21,215.81 (20% of \$106,079.04).
- Vice President Ware-DeVaull moved to open and approve Report 63-70 E-Rate Structured Cabling and Structured Fiber Cabling and it was supported by Treasurer Belk.

- c. Report 63-71 2025-26 E-Rate Network Electronics: 2025-26 E-Rate, 20% from the Bond
- This project will cover refreshing network closet equipment (UPS units and switches) and adding additional network closets as needed for the following schools- Stevenson, Birney K-8, Levey, Thompson K-8, Southfield A&T. We are utilizing the E-Rate program for this project, which will allow us to receive up to 80% back on this project. The bid from Delta Network Services was accurate, complete, and substantially lower. This is the vendor who has provided all of our network electronics in the district and aligns with what we currently have in place. The purchase and installation of network electronics is in the amount of \$80,563.06 (20% of \$402,815.32) from Delta Network Services.

#### 7. Information Items

## a. Report 63-79 Preliminary Approval of Playground Equipment and Installation Costs: Bond Funds

• This report seeks preliminary approval from the Board of Education in the amount of \$550,000.00 for the replacement and installation of playground equipment at Stevenson Elementary School (RFP 2025-07). This initiative is part of the District's broader facility improvement strategy and supports student wellness, safety, and engagement. Due to the time-sensitive nature of outdoor installation work and vendor lead times, preliminary approval is requested now so that, once bids for RFP 2025-07 are received, the District can proceed without delay—saving approximately two weeks in the decision-making process. For comparison, the Adler Elementary School playground project cost approximately \$350,000.00. This proactive step will help maintain critical summer construction timelines and minimize disruption to the school year.

## b. Report 63-80 BP #28 Levey Middle School Roofing Upgrades: Bond Funds

• The project scope includes the demolition of the existing roof and the installation of a new roofing system covering the entirety of the building. The total award amount for BP #28 is \$2,220,540.00. The contingency amount for BP #28 is 10% of the project total value. The contingency amount is \$222,054.00, bringing the construction total to \$2,442,594.00.

## c. Report 63-81 Abatement Services at Levey Middle School: Bond Funds

 The Bond Team recommends awarding the Asbestos Abatement Services to Qualified Abatement Services, Inc. The work scope encompasses the necessary services for this project. The total award recommendation is for \$332,640.00 including contingency based on the Total Environmental Services, LLC Inc. bid of \$302,400.00.

## d. Report 63-82 Abatement Services at Thompson K-8: Bond Funds

 The Bond Team recommends awarding the Asbestos Abatement Services to Qualified Abatement Services, Inc. The work scope encompasses the necessary services for this project. The total award recommendation is for \$48,400.00 including contingency based on the Qualified Abatement Services, Inc. bid of \$44,000.00.

## e. Report 63-83 New Construction & Specialty Renovations Fanning/Howey Associates, Inc, Amendment No. 2: Bond Funds

- The Amendment identifies Soils and Materials Engineering, Inc. as a consultant to Fanning/Howey
  Associated, Inc., for roofing at SA&T and U K-12. The compensation amendments for these
  services is a fixed fee of \$137,200.00: SA&T \$82,800.00 and U K-12 \$55,400.00.
- f. Report 63-84 Geotechnical Services Amendment No. 2 Notification: Bond Funds
- The Amendment adds services for SA&T and U K-12. The total compensation amendment for the services is \$67,800.00: SA&T \$27,300.00 and U K-12 \$40,500.00.
