

Re: Adult Meal Price Increase

Due to the attached memorandum from USDA and the Minnesota Department of Education Food & Nutrition Service, the price the Child Nutrition Department charges for adult lunch meals must increase.

The new minimum adult price is \$3.70. Currently, the charge is \$3.60 for an adult lunch meal. If the meal price for adults could be increased to \$3.75, which may cover future increases from USDA. Also, \$3.75 is simpler to make change for the cashiers.

Summer Food Service Program

2015 Minimum Meal Prices for Adults

Summer Food Service Program funds may not subsidize non-program meals. Meals purchased by adults must be priced high enough so that the cost of the meal is fully paid by the customer.

The minimum meal prices for adults shown below are set by the current rate of federal reimbursement received for each meal type, including the value of U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Foods, and rounded up to the nearest five cents.

Minimum Adult Prices

Breakfast: \$2.10

Lunch: \$3.70

Snack: \$.90
