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## <u>Goal One – Learning</u>



Our shift to Competency-Based Education is picking up steam. Our Vanguard teachers -Mrs. Mastny, Mrs. Mandru, Mrs. Herndon & Mrs. Eiland - took the lead on organizing our assessment and feedback framework, and then shared this vision with our staff during the last SIP Day. Teachers have already begun implementing CBE-aligned work in the classroom. In 5th grade, one student celebrated a 92% on his pre-assessment. After rescoring the pre-assessment with the CBE tool, he was able to identify an "I Can" statement he needed to improve. This shift to competency-based education will have a significant impact on our students' ability to own their own learning!

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
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## **Goal Two – Whole Student Development**

Mrs. Sanchez, our Student Experience Coordinator, has taken the lead in organizing student-created clubs. These clubs are rooted in our core values and beliefs and have been an incredible success at Prairieview over 80 students have been involved in 5 new clubs, with even more on the horizon.
