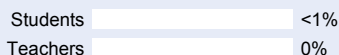

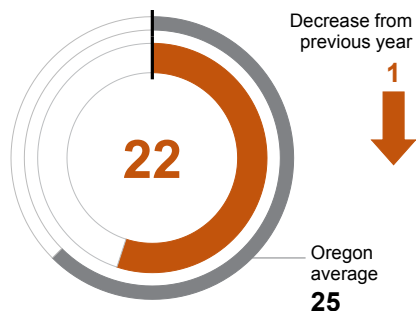

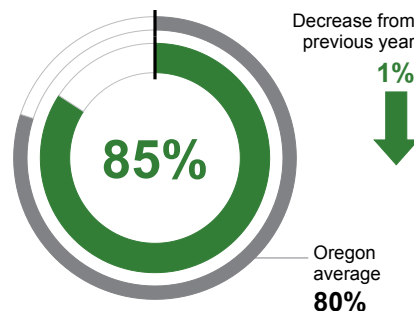

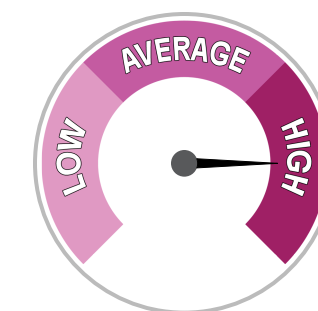

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

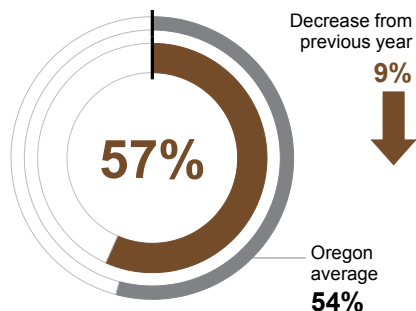
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

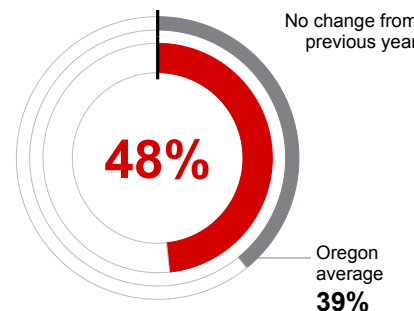
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

We strive to be a model middle school in the State of Oregon. Using a student centered middle school model we create a safe, positive learning environment where students become life-long learners through relevant, challenging and engaging academics.

State Goals

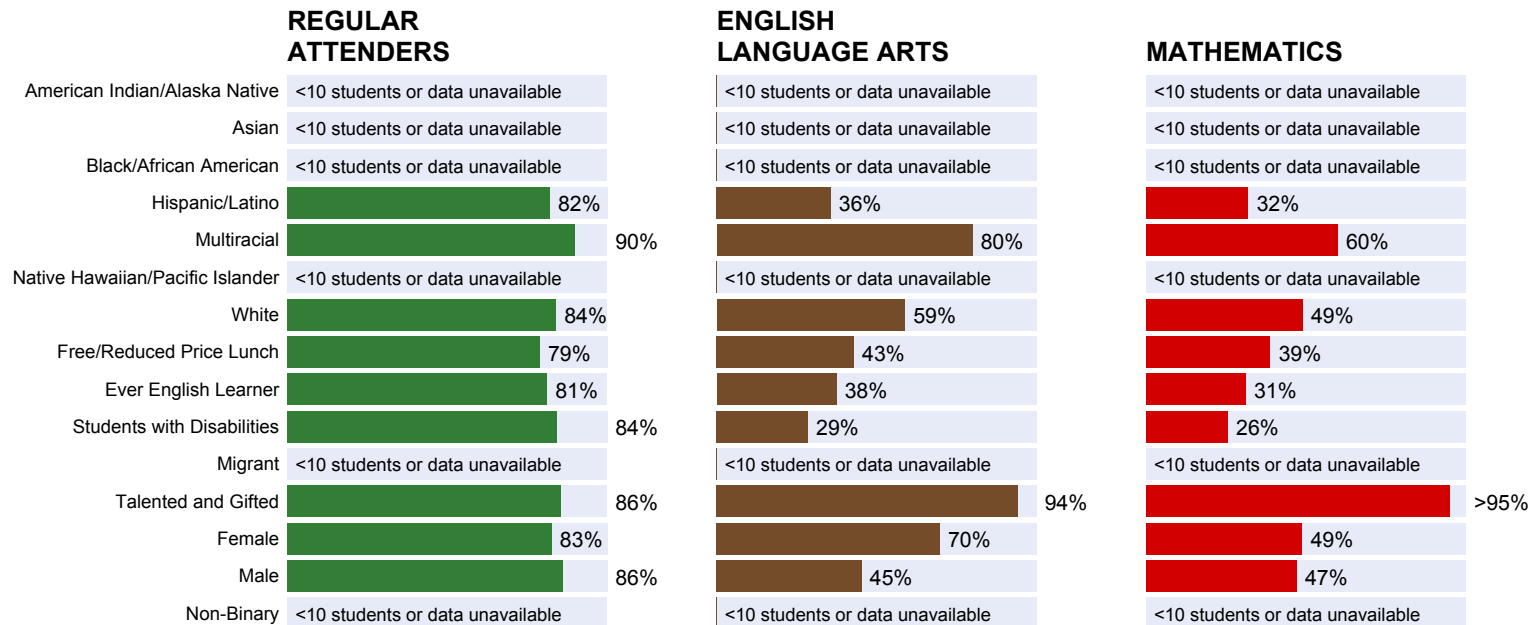

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Our advisory and leadership class curriculum focus on safe student conduct and positive behaviors through PBIS. We follow an extensive safety plan that is taught to students every trimester that focuses on mind and body. Our students have daily access to a full-time administrator and counselor to provide support to all students who at any one time do not feel safe at school.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our school provides a wide range of sports, music, and technology offerings. Cross Country, football, volleyball, wrestling, basketball and track and field are our school sports. We also offer band in all grades, music electives for 6th graders, and a Lego Robotics team to all grades.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

We have a very healthy parent group that supports students in providing support for student activities outside of the school budget. Recent support includes microscopes, 3D printers, and a new projection screen for the gym. We also have strong parent participation in after-school sports and music concerts.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We are proud of our community engagement. Our keystone project is our annual Day of Service, where every student spends one day in our school district boundary cleaning, weeding, painting, and engaging in a wide variety of activities to support non-profit organizations. We also have a very active relationship with the Lion's Club and the Mudd-Nick Foundation. Each of these groups support us financially in a wide-variety of school activities and field trips.
